- 1) Call to order: 7:00 P.M.
- 2) Approval of minutes September 23, 2010 meeting: Approved as written

 - a) Canemah Neighborhood Park: Kurt Lango and Heidi Baker of Lango Hansen Landscape Architects, the City's project consultant, provided an update on the project. Based on review and feedback from two recent neighborhood/community meetings, a few changes have been made to the plan. The most up to date plan was presented and discussed.

Staff will do some additional research regarding this and the topic will be continued at the next meeting.

There is currently one applicant, and the City is continually advertising and recruiting applicants for a number of different board positions including PRAC's. RECOMMENDED ACTION (Motion):

Staff recommends City Commission approval of the Real Estate Agreement for a purchase in the amount of \$120,00 plus closing costs for approximately 7.2 acres of property in the Canemah area for park and open spaces purposes.

BACKGROUND:

The City Commission previously identified the Canemah area as a targeted priority for acquiring open spaces with the available funding from the Metro Natural Areas regional bond measure (2006) Local Legacy Share Allocation. Oregon City's allocation from the Local Share program is \$988,728. To date, Oregon City has utilized \$525,000 of its Local Legacy Share Allocation funding towards the Glen Oak Road park property purchase. This property acquisition proposes to make use of a portion of the City's remaining balance of \$463,728 from the local share funding.

The parcel proposed to be purchased is ideally located within the identified area, and meets the criteria of the Local Legacy Share Allocation program. It is directly adjacent to the existing Metro regional open spaces within Canemah. The owner of the property is a willing seller, which is a requirement of the use of the Metro bond funds. The City and the seller believe the purchase price is well below market value, in part because the seller is motivated to have the property become park land. The major terms of the proposed purchase agreement are as follows:

- Purchase price is \$120,000.
- City and seller to each pay half of closing costs.
- · Seller to pay all real estate commission fees.
- The agreement provides for a due diligence period through the closing date, which allows the City to cancel the purchase agreement for any reason during this time. This allows us to further investigate the property, such as performing an environmental assessment, to ensure there are no currently unknown issues or concerns with the property.
- Closing will occur no later than December 31, 2010 if City does not cancel agreement prior.

The Local Legacy Share Allocation funding is received via a reimbursement process; therefore the purchase will be made with our available Parks System Development Charges (SDC) fund. Reimbursement to this fund with the Metro funds will occur after purchase.

PRAC members:

A number of valid questions and potential concerns have been raised regarding this topic. As I explained in my original e-mail, the direction I received from the City Commission and timing of this negotiation created the unusual circumstance that the purchase agreement had to be placed on a City Commission agenda prior to having discussed this at a PRAC meeting. The parameters of this purchase require some further explanation, as is evident with the questions and issues that have been raised. For example, the funds for this purchase are for specific purposes and must meet specific criteria, etc. To resolve this, I have come up with a proposed solution:

We need to leave the approval of the purchase and sale agreement on the Commission's agenda tomorrow so as not to compromise the timing of the proposed deal. However, I am going to recommend to the City Commission that they request PRAC review this issue at your next meeting (December 2). This will be during the due diligence period of the agreement, and allows for you to review and provide feedback or make any specific recommendations to the City Commission *prior* to the closing of the purchase if it goes forward. Our purchase agreement with the seller allows the City to terminate for any reason during the due diligence period should it be necessary. The City has until December 31st to close on the property, so if the Commission following your December 2 meeting. I will be prepared to give you a comprehensive report on this subject and you will have the opportunity to have all of your concerns and questions addressed at that meeting.

Thanks for your understanding and sorry for any confusion created by this process. Please let me know if you have any other questions.

Sorry to chime in late, but I just got back into town and this is my first chance to comment. I agree with what Ted has to say below. Given the seller's desire to close before the end of this year, it almost feels like we're helping someone out of a tax situation and rushing to spend money on a piece of property that is not otherwise desirable or likely to be developed. Is there a time limit on the city's expenditure of these funds? Are the funds earmarked for greenspace/natural areas, or could it be spent on land that could become more active/developed park space when city funds would be available for park development?

If that's the case, are we just transferring ownership of this property when it will likely remain undisturbed anyway?

I'm not trying to be difficult, just wanting to get a better grasp on the justification for this kind of expenditure, regardless of who is spending the money.

Ted,

Thanks for your feedback. Your observations about the property are correct and you raise some valid points. The intent of this purchase would be to preserve open space and continue the "green belt" around the Canemah area. The purpose would not be for typical active park development, but more for connectivity of natural areas and green spaces. This parcel is adjacent to the Metro owned properties to the south and west of this parcel. I've highlighted the adjacent Metro property on the attached map to point this out.

This type of acquisition (open space preservation) is one of the major goals of the bond measure funding. Also, these funds cannot be used for any development purposes (acquisition only) so they could not be allocated toward the new high school area park construction.

Hope this clarifies the issue. If you have further questions please let me know.

Scott, thank you for sharing this information.

I'm familiar with the area and my first thought was the property is not well suited for park space. I drove to the site on Sunday and could see nothing to change my opinion. The majority of the property looks to be on a steep slope that would be prohibitive for most any recreational activities and costly for construction and maintenance. Anything I'm missing in my summary? My recommendation would be to renegotiate the priority and use the funding elsewhere. Perhaps there is a better, more suitable piece of land in the Canemah area, or in my opinion a high priority would be to allocate funding toward the new high school area park construction if this activity qualifies under this bond measure.

PRAC members,

I want to bring to your attention a pending acquisition of park property. Due to some unusual timing issues I will not able to bring this to you prior to the pending action by the City Commission. On the City Commission agenda next Wednesday, 11/17 is a Real Estate Agreement for a purchase in the amount of \$120,00 plus closing costs for approximately 7.2 acres of property in the Canemah area for park and open spaces purposes. Some of you may recall our Metro bond measure Local Legacy Share Allocation project list that was developed in 2006. I realize that many of you were not involved with the committee at that time, and you may not be aware of this issue. I have attached an update I provided to the City Commission in September, which provides an overview of the program, with a list of the priorities and dollar amounts.

City Commission and PRAC identified the Canemah area as a targeted priority for acquiring open spaces with the available funding from the Metro Natural Areas regional bond measure (2006) Local Legacy Share Allocation. To date, Oregon City has utilized \$525,000 of its Local Legacy Share Allocation funding towards the Glen Oak Road park property purchase. This property acquisition proposes to make use of a portion of the City's remaining balance of \$463,728 from the local share funding. The parcel proposed to be purchased is ideally located within the identified area, and meets the criteria of the Local Legacy Share Allocation program. It is directly adjacent to the existing Metro regional open spaces within Canemah. The owner of the property is a willing seller, which is a requirement of the use of the Metro bond funds. The City and the seller believe the purchase price is well below market value, in part because the seller is motivated to have the property become park land. The agreement provides for a due diligence period through the closing date, which allows the City to cancel the purchase agreement for any reason during this time. This allows us to further investigate the property, such as performing an environmental assessment, to ensure there are no currently

unknown issues or concerns with the property. Closing will occur no later than December 31, 2010 if City does not cancel agreement prior.

The timing issue with this is that, due to the confidential nature of property negotiation for the city, this matter has only been discussed in executive sessions by the City Commission to this point. Staff received direction to pursue the final agreement at an executive session meeting last Wednesday. And, because of the seller's motivation to close on the property prior to December 31^{st} , we have to place the purchase agreement on the Commission agenda next Wednesday. Therefore, since your next meeting date is December 2, I do not have the opportunity to present this to you prior to it being acted on. I am copying a link to the complete agenda item on our website with report attachments, including the maps of the property. It is item # 7. C . on the agenda.
