RESOLUTION

Whereas, Clackamas County is desirous of locating a proper place on Main Street in Oregon City, Oregon, to provide office space and necessary room for the Commissary to take care of unemployment relief situation, and

Whereas, Gordon Miller has agreed to lease to Clackamas County the store room on the northerly end of what is known as the C. G. Miller Garage at 9th and Main streets in Oregon City for a period of one year in consideration of the cancellation of the taxes on said property for the year 1929, and

Whereas, Oregon City is entitled to a portion of the taxes due on said property, and

Whereas, Oregon City is desirous of assisting in taking care of the unemployment relief situation, and

Whereas, the County Court of Clackamas County has agreed to accept the proposal of Gordon Miller, provided that the City of Oregon City should consent to the cancellation of the taxes for the year 1929 on said property,

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved by the City Commission of Oregon City that the City of Oregon City hereby consents to the cancellation of the taxes for the year 1929 on said property in consideration of Gordon Miller giving the use of said store room in said building to Clackamas County for unemployment relief purposes for one year.
