On motion the following resolution was adopted.

RESOLUTION

A Resolution setting forth the claims of the City of Oregon City for a share in the distribution of State Gasoline Tax Revenues for street purposes.

WHEREAS, many of the streets of this city have been improved by special assessments against the adjoining property owner:

WHEREAS, many of these streets have been badly worn by years of use by automobiles and trucks,

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WHEREAS? PROPERTY OWNERS ARE UNABLE TO RECONSTRUCT AND MAINTAIN THESE streets by additional assessments, since many of the priginal assessments have not yet been paid;

WHEREAS, the property in this city is already so heavily burdened by the general property tax that additional revenues for street reconstruction and maintenance from this source are not available;

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WHEREAS, it has become necessary for this city to secure revenues for street purposes from some source other than the property tax;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the 1937 legislature should by legislation provide that the cities of Oregon should receive a share of the gross revenues of the State Highway Commission of the State of Oregon for street purposes as follows:

1937 - 5 per cent, yielding approximately \$686,000. 1938 - 6 per cent, yielding approximately \$823,770. 1939 - 7 per cent, yielding approximately \$961,065. 1940 and thereafter, 72 per cent, yielding not less than \$1,000,000.

Said total sum to be a cash distribution to the cities of Oregon in the ratio of their population, as shown by the latest United States Census.

Said funds to be expended for street construction and/or maintenance under the direction of the city administration or by special arrangement with the State Highway Commission, county highway departments, or others.

The State Highway Commission to continue all highway expenditutes on highways within cities as now required and hereafter established by state statute.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be forwarded to members of the legislature for their information and that one copy be sent to the League of Oregon Cities.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the State of Oregon by its Highway Commission is constructing and re-aligning Pacific Highway No. 99-East, which passes through the City of Oregon City.

WHEREAS, in the carrying out of the said improvement a portion of the storm sewer located on Hawley Avenue South of the under-crossing of the Southern Pacific Railroad tracks, which was placed by the city some twenty or more years ago will be covered by the pavement of the new highway.

WHEREAS, said storm sewer pipe is deteriorated and damaged to such extent that it is not advisable to leave it in service under the proposed new pavement.

WHEREAS, the State of Oregon acting through its Highway Department has agreed to repair and replace a portion of the storm sewer if the City of Oregon City will pay one-half of the cost of the installation of the sewer in accordance with the agreement proposed by the Highway Department.

NOW THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Oregon City be and it is hereby authorized by its proper officials to enter into the agreement with the State Highway Department, a copy of which agreement is hereto attached and by this reference made a part hereof, and to do all things necessary for the proper carrying out of said agreement.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 18th day of February, 1937, by and between the State of Ofegon by its STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION, hereinafter called the state, party of the first part, and the CITY OF OREGON CITY, a municipal corporation, by its City Council, hereinafter called the city, party of the second part; WITNESSETH,

RECITALS;

1. The Pacific Highway, Route No. 99-East, is a part of the state highway system and likewise a part of the federal highway system; and said highway as located and improved, passes through the City of Oregon City in part over certain established and improved streets.

2. Both the state and the city are interested in a re-alignment and improvement of a portion of said highway within the corporate limits of the City of Oregon City for the purpose of making possible a more convenient and safe thoroughfare for public traffic.

3. A portion of the route selected for the improvement includes the construction of an underpass under the Southern Pacific Railroad tracks, and the widening and reconstruction of a portion of Hawley Avenue south of said undercrossing.

4. Along a portion of this Hawley Avenue there now is an eighteen inch clay sweer pipe placed by the city some twenty or more years ago. The location of this sewer is such that it will be covered by the new pavement included in the project now under contract. An inspection of this sewer shows that it is now deteriorated and damaged to such an extent that it is not advisable to leave it in service under the proposed new pavement. The damaged sewer extends from approximately Engineer's Station 65-4.23 to approximately Engineer's Station 72 + 62, as shown on the attached sketch which is hereby made a part of this agreement.

5. It is considered that that portion of this section between approximately Engineer's Station 65+23 and Engineer's Station 70 + 22 lies so far below the grade of Hawley Avenue that it is improbable that construction work on this section should have materially contributed to the damage and deterioration. That portion of the sewer lying between approximately Engineer's Station 70 + 22 and 72 + 62 shows evidence of recent damage, and it is considered probable that such damage was caused by adjacent construction work.

6. The parties to this Agreement are mutually interested in the replacement of the damaged portions of this sewer prior to the placing of the new pavement on this section.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals, and in consideration of the mutual benefits to be shared both by the state and the city, IT IS HEREBY AGREED, as follows:

1. The state shall, by agreement with its contractor on this section of highway improvement (State Highway Contract No. 1854) arrange for and supervise the installation of a new 18 inch concrete pipe sewer between Engineer's Stations approximately $65. \pm 23$ and Engineer's Station approximately 72 ± 62 .

2. The cost of the installation of this sewer in that section between approximately Engineer's Station 65+23 and approximately 70 + 22shall be shared equally by the state and by the city. The installation in this section shall include the necessary trench excavation pipe and two manholes, one at approximately Engineer's Station 65 + 42.7, and another at approximately Engineer's Station 67 + 84. The total estimated cost of this section is as follows:

It is agreed that this estimate shall not be binding upon either party but that the division of cost shall be made equally on the actual cost of the work in this section upon its completion.

3. The cost of the installation of the new sewer in that section between approximately Engineer's Station 70 + 22 and 72 + 62, including the cost of the manholes at Stations 70 + 22 and 72 + 52.9,

and 72 + 62, shall be borne entirely by the state.

4. As soon as convenient after the completion of the work described above, the state will make up an itemized list showing the total cost thereof and shall present a bill for one-half the cost of the section between Engineer's Station 65 + 23 and Engineer's Station 70 +22, to the city. Upon receiptsof said bill, the city shall reimburse the state for its share of the cost thereof.
