SPECIAL MEETING:

The City Commission met in special session at the office of the City Manager at 1:00 o'clock p.m., on the above date.

Roll call showed the following present:-

The purpose of the meeting was the second reading of Ordinance No. 1308, an ordinance relating to National Defense, providing for observance of black-outs or other restrictions imposed by Civil authorities or by the Army or Navy of the United States, or both, closing of certain areas, providing for penalties for violation thereof, and declaring an emergency.

Ordinance No. 1308 was read second time and on motion placed on final passage, and it appearing from the certificate of Margaret Darrow, principal clerk of the Publisher of the Oregon City Enterprise, that the same had been properly published as required by the Charter, and on motion and roll call the ordinance was passed. The vote on the passage of said ordinance being as follows:

Ayes: Woodward, Farr, and Krueger.

A petition having been received for the vacation of a portion of Main Street in Canemah between block 30 and 31, on motion the City Attorney was instructed to proceed with the necessary proceedings for such vacation.

A communication was read from Dr. McLean tendering his resignation from the Library Board, which after due consideration was accepted.
