The following ordinance was introduced and passed on first reading.

ORDINANCE NO. 1357

An ordinance making it unlawful for any person to consume alcoholic liquor while an occupant of a motor vehicle while such vehicle is parked or being driven on any street or highway in Oregon City.

OREGON CITY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to consume alcoholic liquor while an occupant of a motor vehicle while such vehicle is parked or being driven on any street or highway in Oregon City.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not exceeding \$300.00 or by imprisonment in the city jail for a period not exceeding ninety days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Read first time and ordered published at an adjourned regular meeting of the City Commission held on the 4th day of February, 1949, and to come up for second reading and final passage at a regular meeting of the City Commission to be held on the 2nd day of March, 1949, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock p.m.

Ordinance #1356, an ordinance regulating the delivery or dispensing of flammable liquids into the fuel tanks of motor vehicles or other containers, was read the second time and on motion placed on its final passage, and it appearing from the certificate of Van Hoy O. Ballou, principal clerk of the publisher of the Oregon City Enterprise, that the same had been properly published as required by Charter, the ordinance was passed.

Upon motion the Commission appointed a charter revision committee to canvas any objections to the provisions contained in the present City Charter, the committee to recommend to the Commission changes necessary to remove any objections found and the Commission may then place the recommendations in proper legal form for submitting to the voters in the near future. The Commission appointed the following citizens to the committee and instructed the City Manager to notify them of their appointment and enclose a copy of the City Charter for their study.

Upon motion it was decided to call a special meeting of the Commission at 4:00 p.m., Friday, February 11.

The City Manager presented a letter and plan from the Southern Pacific Railroad requesting the City to lower the grade on 14th Street under their overhead trackage between Main and Washington Street. The Railroad was having difficulty maintaining its alignment at this point due to vehicular trucks on 14th Street carrying high loads and striking the girders supporting the trackage. After some discussion the City Manager was directed to make a full investigation and report back to the Commission at a future date.

The City Attorney brought up the matter of the Fessler case and informed the Commission that the case could be settled by the City paying \$400 and the insurance company \$300. By unanimous vote of the Commission the City ^{Attorney} was directed to settle the case in this manner and ordered warrants drawn to pay the \$400.

The City Attorney discussed the proposed ordinance concerning the impounding of vehicles that have received numerous tickets for violation of the traffic ordinance. It was decided to lay the matter over until the next regular meeting.

The City Manager read a letter from the State Sanitary Authority concerning the construction of the City's sewage treatment plant and was authorized to answer the letter and tell the Sanitary Authority that the building of the plant had been postponed until conditions became more favorable for that kind of construction.

The Commission approved the City Manager's selection of the City officers to receive the League of Oregon Cities' Newsletter, the Western City Magazine, the Legislative Bulletin, The American Municipal News, and the Washington Newsletter.

Upon motion the City Manager was authorized to purchase 12 new parking meters complete, a coin separator for separating parking meter money, 500' of 2½" fire hose, 2 filing cabinets for the City Manager's office, to have a program printed for the A.A.U. Basketball Tournament under the auspices of the Recreation Department, and to trade in the old ~~Buff~~ loader and Case tractor in the Street Department for a new loader and tractor to cost approximately \$5,000.

The City Commission approved a new set-up in the Fire Department requested by Chief Locke in which there would be the following officers:

There being no futher business the meeting adjourned.
