

The City Manager brought up the request of the Red Cross for identification cards issued under authority of Ordinance #1333 for all Red Cross cars without paying the prescribed fee. After some discussion the request was denied.

The City Manager was instructed to inform the Judge of the Recorder's Court that the fines levied for minor traffic violations were considered by the Commission to be too high.

The City Manager discussed with the Commission the progress being made on the Rivercrest sewers. The plans concerning the proposed addition to the City Hall were also discussed.

The Commission instructed the City Manager to have the Police watch trucks parking longer than allowed by ordinance especially over the weekends. Also to investigate the rumors of gambling and card games being conducted at some unknown address on Main Street or any place in the city.

The City Attorney was instructed to prepare and present to the Commission at the next regular meeting an ordinance prohibiting punch boards and similiar devices. Also to investigate the legality of punch boards.

The City Attorney and the City Manager were instructed to investigate the property built in 5th Street between Jackson & Van Buren, to secure the name of the owner, the names of the tenants and inform them that the structure would have to be removed from the street within a certain prescribed period which would give the tenants enough time to find other places to live.

There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting adjourned.

Ordinance #1351, an ordinance vacating all of that portion of Marshall Street between Linn Avenue and a place on said Marshall Street where the extended Westerly lines of Tracts 11 and 22 of Ryan's Mount Pleasant Tracts No. 1 according to the duly recorded plat thereof in Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon, meet, was read the second time and on motion placed on its final passage, and it appearing from the certificate of VanHoy O. Ballou, principal clerk of the Publisher of the Oregon City Enterprise, that the same had been properly published as required by the Charter, the ordinance was passed.

Mr. Clinton Mansfield appeared before the Commission concerning the granting of licenses to peddlers and for consessions at Kelly Field during the Oregon City Centennial Association celebration August 12 to 15th inclusive. Upon motion the licensing of peddlers and the granting of consessions during the Centennial celebration August 12 to 15th inclusive was turned over to the Oregon City Centennial Association.

Mr. Robert Mulvey in the company of the Recreation Director and Assistant Director appeared before the Commission requesting the installation of more lights for night athletics at Kelly Field. In support of their request a bid from Mr. S. E. Lawrence for \$6,481.63 which included the cost of 91 new lights was submitted. However, they added as an absolute minimum the installation of 51 new lights and the rental of transformers the job could be done for approximately \$4,000.00. The City Commission promised to give their request every consideration and would let them know at a later date as to what their decision would be.

Mr. Robert Epperson representing the Oregon National Guard appeared before the Commission requesting in the name of the State a lease on a portion of the land at Water Board Park for the purpose of erecting two quonset huts to be used as a temporary armory. After due consideration the request was granted and the City Manager and City Attorney were directed to secure a description of the property and draw the terms of lease for presentation at the next meeting.

The City Attorney read the proposed new ordinance for prohibiting punch boards requested at the last regular meeting. After some discussion and upon motion the ordinance was laid over until the next regular meeting.

Upon motion Mr. George Helzêr was appointed to a three-year term on the Budget Committee.

Mr. Caufield announced the appointment of the following citizens to the Planning Commission to be established under Ordinance #1350 and set the date of the first preliminary organizational meeting for 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, April 20, at the office of the City Manager at the City Hall.
