After due consideration and on motion duly passed, the motion made May 1, 1946 passing the first reading of Ordinance No. 1332 and directing its publication, was rescinded and the number of the ordinance ordered given to the following Ordinance which was read first time and on motion ordered published.

ORDINANCE NO. 1332

AN ORDINANCE licensing punchboards and declaring an emergency.

OREGON CITY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, co-partnership, or corporation within the City of Oregon City to have, operate, lease, place, or permit to be operated or used or to have in his possession any punchboard without first paying a license fee as provided herein.

Section 2. The license fee for each board shall be one hundred times the unit of play or cost per punch, and said license shall not be transferable.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 21 years to punch, operate or use or have in his possession any punchboard

or for anyone to permit any person under 21 years of age to punch or operate a punchboard.

Section 4. All punchboards shall be presented to the City Recorder and the license fee paid before circulation or use, and the City Recorder shall thereupon duly license the same and affix the necessary sticker or stamp and only legal punchboards, commonly referred to as "question and answer" punchboards, wherein mental skill is required to answer questions, are permitted.

Section 5. All illegal punchboards and punchboards not operated under a license herein shall be seized by the Chief of Police.

Section 6. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 7. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not exceeding \$300.00 or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 8. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Oregon City, in this: That there are a number of unlicensed punchboards being operated in the City of Oregon City which require immediate regulation, therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the City Commission and approval by the Mayor.

Read first time and ordered published at a special meeting of the City Commission held on the 9th day of May, 1946, and to come up for second reading and final passage at a special meeting of the City Commission to be held on the 20th day of May, 1946, at the hour of 1:00 o'clock p.m.

SPECIAL MEETING:

The City Commission met in special session on the above date in the office of the City Manager at 1:00 o'clock p.m.

The purpose of the meeting was first, to canvas the votes cast at the election held on the 17th for the annexation of additional territory to Oregon City; and second, Ordinance No. 1333 was read first time and on motion ordered published.

ORDINANCE NO. 1333

An Ordinance providing parking space for commercial vehicles by use of delivery service permit cards, and providing for the application and issuance thereof upon payment of the fee therefor, and providing for the display of said permit or card, and providing a penalty.

OREGON CITY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Upon the receipt of the proper application the City Recorder is hereby authorized to issue service or delivery permits and vehicle identification cards to firms, corporations, or businesses regularly using vehicles for the delivery of service or the delivery or pickup of merchandise. Such vehicle identification cards shall be issued for a specific motor vehicle in the manner hereinafter provided.
