Ordinance No. 1354 was read the first time and ordered published.

ORDINANCE NO. 1354

An ordinance reducing all of the alley running through Block 44, Clackamas County Addition to Oregon City, according to the duly recorded plat thereof in Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon, between Taylor Street and Pierree Street from 26 feet in width to 12 feet in width in its entirety.

OREGON CITY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That all of that certain alley running through Block 44, Clackamas County Addition to Oregon City, according to the duly recorded plat thereof in Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon, between Taylor Street and Pierce Street, be and the same is hereby reduced from 26 feet in width to 12 feet in width in its entirety, and a strip of land 7 feet in width along the entire northeasterly side of said alley adjoining lots 2 and 7 in said Block 44, and a strip of land 7 feet in width along the entire southwesterly side of said alley adjoining lots 3 and 6 in said Block 44, be and the same are hereby vacated.

Read first time and ordered published at an adjourned regular meeting of the City Commission of Oregon City, Oregon, held on the 4th day of November, 1948, and to come up for second reading and final passage at a regular meeting of said City Commission to be held on the 1st day of December, 1948, at the hour of 1:00 o'clock P.M.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Oregon City has adopted Ordinance #1349 which provides by Section 13 thereof that the City Manager, subject to the approval of the City Commission by resolution may designate no parking areas.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED That the City Manager be and he is hereby authorized and directed

To prohibit parking on both sides of Van Buren Street between Eleventh Street and Twelfth Street between the hours of 7:30 A. M. and 4:00 P. M. every day except Sundays, Saturdays, and School Holidays.

The City Manager presented an ordinance recommended by the police chief concerning the licensing of vending, amusement, cigarette, and music machines to replace Ordinance #1303. After some discussion it was decided to have the police chief in for a more detailed report at the next meeting.

Upon motion the City Manager was authorized to purchase a second-hand canopy burial tent from the Holman, Hankins and Rilance Funeral Home and to have a new cover made for the present city-owned burial tent.

In connection with the two-hour parking limit suggested for 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, High, Center, Washington, John Adams and Jefferson Streets the City Manager read a letter from the City Manager in Eugene concerning an ordinance on a licensed parking area for residential property owners which stated that the ordinance had been challenged in the court and that the Eugene City Council had reviewed the ordinance which resulted in its cancellation. After some discussion no action was taken on the above proposed two-hour parking limit.

The City Manager was requested to make a study of 17th Street from Main Street to Highway 99E in regard to limiting the parking on one side of the street.

The City Manager talked about the League of Oregon Cities convention to be held in Eugene on November 18, 19, & 20 and it was the opinion of the Commissioners that the Commission as well as Commissioner-elect Albert Roake, the City Attorney and the City Manager should attend if possible.

The City Attorney brought up the matter of Miss Mary Fessler falling on the city sidewalk at 8th Street near Railroad Avenue and who through the firm of Beatie & Hibbard, Attorneys at Law, has filed a suit against the city for real damages in the amount of \$125.00 and general damages of \$5,000.00. After some discussion the City Attorney was instructed to see if a settlement could not be reached outside of the court.
