The matter of redistributing the duties of the departments of the City Administration was brought up and after some discussion Ordinance No. 1374 was read first time and ordered published.

ORDINANCE NO. 1374

An ordinance redistributing the duties of the departments of the City Administration and assigning other duties to the departments and assigning the Commissioners to certain departments and declaring an emergency.

OREGON CITY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Department No. 1 shall have charge of finance, streets, planning commission and health and Mayor- Commissioner Albert Roake is hereby assigned to said department.

Section 2. Department No. 2 shall have charge of police, municipal court, law and fire and Commissioner Richard W. Long is hereby assigned to said department.

Section 3. Department No. 3 shall have charge of water, public property and recreation and Commissioner George Helzer is hereby assigned to said department.

Section 4. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, public health and safety of Oregon City, in this: That it is necessary that the duties of the departments of the City administration be redistributed among the Commissioners and other departments added immediately, therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Commission and approval by the Mayor.

Read first time and ordered published at an adjourned regular meeting of the Commission held on the 11th day of January, 1951, and to come up for second reading and final passage at a regular meeting of the Commission to be held on the 7th day of February, 1951, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P.M.

The logs to be sawed into lumber to be used where needed throughout the city; the old wooden stairs on Hedges Street in Canemah to be barricaded as they were in dangerous condition and if it was found that the stairs were needed by enough people they would be rebuilt, using some of the above mentioned lumber.

Upon motion the City Manager was authorized to have Mr. Heater and Mr. Strohmeier attend the Road and Street Conference on February 15 and 16 at Oregon State College in Corvallis.

The City Manager brought up the matter of the City employees' Five Year Award Plan and after some discussion it was decided that in as much as there were only a few to receive pins, no dinner would be held this year, but all employees entitled to pins would be requested to attend a Commissioners' Meeting where the pins would be awarded.
