AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF VAN BUREN STREET IN THE PLAT OF OREGON CITY, OREGON, HEREIN MORE PARTICULARLY DECREED.

WHEREAS, It appears to the Commission of Oregon City, Oregon, that on the 7th day of December , 1960, a Resolution was duly adopted initiating action for the vacation of a portion of Van Buren Street in Oregon City, hereinafter described and thereafter the City Recorder caused Notice to be given by posting and publication as required by haw and that proof of said posting and publication is on file with the City Recorder and that the matter of said vacation, together with a hearing of any objections or claims to be heard and considered concerning said vacation of said portion of said street would be heard and considered at 12:00 Noon on the 11th day of January , 1961, in the Commission meeting room at the City Hall in Oregon City, Oregon, and said hearing having been held and it appearing that said vacation is in the public interest and that all expenses and assessments in connection therewith have been paid, now, therefore,

OREGON CITY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the following described portion of Van Buren Street in Oregon City, Oregon, to-wit:

Beginning at the most easterly corner of Lot 1, Block 164, Oregon City; thence Southeasterly along Seventh Street to the most northerly corner of Lot 8, Block 34, Clackamas County Addition to Oregon City; thence Southwesterly along the northwesterly line of Lots 8 and 7, Block 34, Clackamas County Addition to Oregon City, to the most westerly corner of said Lot 7, Block 34, Clackamas County Addition to Oregon City; thence Northwesterly in a straight line to the most sougherly corner of Lot 2, Block 164, Oregon City; thence Northeasterly along the sougheasterly line of Lots 2 and 1, Block 164, Oregon City, to the place of beginning, in the County of Clackamas and State of Oregon.

Roscoe Lock, Fire Chief of Oregon City personally inspected the two residence buildings of Gladys Merritt Gonsalves located at 18th Street (McLoughlin Ave.) near 18th and Polk Street on tax lot 157, and found that one residence which was partially destroyed by fire on November 29, 1930, as well as the other residence building on said property were in a dangerous condition and should be repaired or torn down, and so advised the City Manager by letter on August 23, 1960.

On August 31, 1960, a title report of said property was obtained from Commonwealth Title Insurance Company and it was found that the record owner of the property was Gladys Merritt. Gladys Merritt is now Gladys Merritt Gonsalves.

On September 9, 1960, the City Attorney wrote Gladys Merritt, C/O Mrs. A.L. Wilkinson (her mother) at 940 South Riverside Avenue, Medford, Oregon, the address given by the Assessor's Office concerning the record owner of the property. Mrs. Wilkinson replied on September 12, 1960, saying that they had the place up for sale and she would contact her daughter who was now the owner of the property. On October 10, 1960, the City Attorney wrote Mrs. Wilkinson again and she replied by postcard postmarked October 12, 1960, saying she would contact her, daughter. On October 15, 1960, Gladys Merritt Gonsalves wrote the City Attorney and the City Attorney replied on October 31, 1960. Mrs. Gonsalves wrote again on November 5, 1960, and reply was made by the City Attorney on November 10, 1960, Mrs. Gonsalves wrote again on December 5, 1960, and the City Attorney replied on December 8, 1960. The purport of the letters was that Mrs. Gonsalves wanted to tear down the old house which was partially burned and repair the other one and that she or her husband would come up and inspect the property, which they were not able to do and a generally wanted time to do something, either sell the property or do as above. The City Attorney's letters were addressed to Mrs. Gladys ... Merritt Gonsalves, C/O Merritt Studio. at 3683 b Mt. Diablo Blvd., Lafayette, California, and this address was given by Mrs. Gonsalves on her stationery to the City Attorney. On December 5, 1960, City Commission of Oregon City set January 4, 1961, in the Commission Chambers at 8:00 P.M., as the time for hearing on said matter and ordered the City Attorney and City Recorder to take necessary steps in accordance with Ordnance No. 1260, being the Ordinance governing the prevention of dangerous buildings. Diablo Blvd., Lafayette, California, by registered mail, a copy of notice above and of the date of the hearing on January 4, 1961, which registered letter was returned unclaimed.

The City Attorney telephoned Mrs. Gonsalves personally on January 6, 1961, and advised her of the registered letter being returned, the date of the hearing and her non-appearance. FURTHER ORDERED, that if the orders of this Commission be not obeyed and said buildings removed within said 20 day period the Commission will order said buildings removed at the expense of the property on which the same is situated.
