Ordinance #1343, an Ordinance making a tax levy for Oregon City for the last six months of the year 1947 and first six months of the year 1948 ending June 30, 1948 was read the second time and on motion placed on its final passage, and it appearing from the certificate of VanHoy O. Ballou, principal clerk of the Publisher of the Oregon City Enterprise, that the same had been properly published as required by the Charter, the ordinance was passed.

Ordinance #1344 was read the first time and ordered published.

ORDINANCE NO. 1344

An ordinance reducing all of the alley running through Block 158, Oregon City, also known as Block 25, County Addition to Oregon City, according to the duly recorded plat thereof, in Clackamas County, Oregon, between J.Q. Adams Street and Jackson Street, from 26 feet in width to 12 feet in width in its entirety

OREGON CITY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That all of that certain alley running through Block 158, Oregon City, also known as Block 25, County Addition to Oregon City, according to the duly recorded plat thereof, in Clackamas County, Oregon, between J.Q. Adams Street and Jackson Street, be and the same is hereby reduced from 26 feet in width to 12 feet in width in its entirety and a strip of land 7 feet in width along the entire Northeasterly side of said alley adjoining lots 2 and 7 in said Block 158, and a strip of land 7 feet in width along the entire Southwesterly side of said alley adjoining lots 3 and 6 in said Block 158, be and the same are hereby vacated.

Read first time and ordered published at an adjourned regular meeting of the City Commission of Oregon City, Oregon, held on the 9th day of July, 1947, and to come up for second reading and final passage at a regular meeting of said City Commission to be held on the 6th day of August, 1947, at the hour of 1:00 o'clock P.M.

WHEREAS, Oregon City is permitted to arrange with the Public Employees Retirement Board under the Public Employees Retirement Act, being Chapter 401, Oregon Laws 1945, for setting up a formula for allowing prior service credit for city employees, and

WHEREAS, the state and public school employees are allowed, under said retirement law, a maximum of twenty years for which prior service credit may be allowed,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Oregon City follow the state and public school employees formula and does hereby allow a maximum of twenty years for which prior service credit may be allowed.
