

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS Oregon City has adopted Ordinance No. 1349 which provides by Section 13 thereof that the City Manager, subject to the approval of the City Commission by resolution, may designate no parking areas and traffic lanes in Oregon City, Oregon,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED That the City Manager, be and he is hereby authorized and directed as follows:

To prohibit parking on the Northerly side of the cut-off at 11th Street and Moss Street between the Pacific Highway 99E and Main Street except that portion where parking meters have been installed.

To designate Railroad Avenue from 7th Street to 9th Street as a one way street with the traffic to travel one way -- in a Northerly direction.

Upon motion it was voted that the City's contribution to the County Health Department be increased \$25.00 per month; the \$300.00 for the year to be paid from the emergency fund of the general department.

Upon motion Mayor Caufield was authorized to purchase \$40,000.00 worth of United State Government Bonds with the monies accumulated in the Sewage Disposal Fund.

Upon motion the City Attorney and the City Manager were requested to investigate and report with their recommendations at the next meeting on the combining of the positions of Treasurer, Deputy Recorder with that of Recorder.

Ordinance #1352, an ordinance making a tax levy for Oregon City for the last six months of the year 1948 and the first six months of the year 1949 ending June 30, 1949 and declaring an emergency, was read the second time and on motion placed on its final passage, and it appearing from the certificate of VanHoy O. Ballou, principal clerk of the Publisher of the Oregon City Enterprise, that the same had been properly published as required by the Charter, the ordinance was passed.

ORDINANCE NO. 1353

An Ordinance vacating all that part of Eighth Street, now known as Marshall Avenue, CANEMAH, according to the duly recorded plat thereof in Clackamas County, Oregon, within the corporate limits of Oregon City, Oregon, which lies between Blocks fifty-six and fifty-seven in said Canemah.

OREGON CITY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That all that part of Eight Street, now know as Marshall Avenue, CANEMAH, according to the duly recorded plat thereof in Clackamas County, Oregon, within the corporate limits of Oregon City, Oregon, which lies between blocks fifty-six and fifty-seven in said Canemah, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Read first time and ordered published at a regular meeting of the City Commission of Oregon City, Oregon, held on the 7th day of July, 1948, and to come up for second reading and final passage at a regular meeting of said City Commission to be held on the 4th day of August, 1948, at the hour of 2:00 P.M. daylight saving time, i.e. 1:00 P.M. Pacific Standard Time.
