Industrial Accident Commission Insurance

The following ordinance was introduced and passed on first reading.

### ORDINANCE NO. 1363

An Ordinance governing the licensing and registration of motor vehicles, licensing the operators and chauffeurs thereof and licenses for wrecking cars by adopting the Oregon Motor Vehicle Law of the State of Oregon, being Chapter 1, Title 115, O.C.L.A.; by adopting the Uniform Operators and Chauffeurs License Act of the State of Oregon, being Chapter 2, Title 115, O.C.L.A; and by adopting Licenses for Wrecking Cars of the State of Oregon, being Chapter 8, Title 115, O.C.L.A.; together with all amendments which are now, or hereafter may be enacted, providing the penalties for the violation thereof, repealing all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict therewith and declaring an emergency.

#### OREGON CITY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Oregon Motor Vehicle Law of the State of Oregon, being Chapter 1, little 115, O.C.L.A.; the Uniform Operators and Chauffeurs License Act of the State of Oregon, being Chapter 2, Title 115, O.C.L.A.; and Licenses for Wrecking Cars of the State of Oregon, being Chapter 8, Title 115, O.C.L.A.; together with all amendments which are now, or hereafter may be enacted, are hereby adopted by reference and made a part of this Ordinance and govern the use, regulation, licensing, registration and operation of motor vehicles and operators thereof, and licenses for wrecking cars within the city limits of Oregon City.

Section 2. All acts which are made unlawful by the said motor vehicle laws in the above mentioned sections shall be considered as offenses against the City of Oregon City when committed within its boundaries and shall be punished by the penalties hereinafter provided, which shall, for the purposes of this Ordinance, supersede all other penalties.

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be subject to a fine in a sum not to exceed \$300.00 or imprisonment in the city jail for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of Oregon City in that it is necessary to regulate the licensing and registration of motor vehicles and the operators thereof and licenses for wrecking cars, therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the City Commission and approval by the Mayor.

Read first time and ordered published at an adjourned regular meeting of the City Commission held on the 7th day of July, 1949, and to come up for second reading and final passage at a regular meeting to be held on the 3rd day of August, 1949, at the hour of eight o'clock p.m. Daylight Saving Time, i.e. 7:00 o'clock p.m. Pacific Standard Time.

Upon motion the cost for special care in the Cemetery was set at \$3.50 per year per grave space.

Upon motion the City Manager was authorized to purchase a police motorcycle equipped with a radio to cost approximately \$1,500.00.

Upon motion the Riverview Apartments were allowed a space in the street directly in front of their entrance to be used similarly as a loading zone, i. e., to discharge and pick up passengers from taxis and private cars.

Upon motion the City Manager was authorized to inaugurate a plan for the formal recognition of satisfactory service by employees over a number of years, to have a die made from which pins could be struck of various metals to be awarded with a certificate to each employee beginning with those who had put in ten years or more with the City. Details of the metal and design of the pins are to be left in the hands of the City Manager and awards to be retroactive to July 1, 1949.

Mr. Stanley Mitchell representing the Moser family appeared before the Commission concerning their attitude on closing the alley running through Block 33, Clackamas County Addition all property adjoining said alley isowned by the Moser's. The Commission stated they would approve the closing of the alley providing the Moser's would sign a statement to the effect that their building housing the butcher shop and grocery store on the S. W. corner of Molalla and Division Streets would be moved back to the line considered to be the south boundary of Division Street as set by the monument in the sidewalk in front of the butcher shop; the moving to take place at such a time when the building would need any major repairs or was to be torn down.

The City Manager read the following letter addressed to the Commission but no action was taken:

Re: Sewage Disposal
Mt. Pleasant School

Dear Sirs:

In our report to the city for the month of September, 1948, we pointed out that there was a proposed construction of an eight-class-room addition to the Mt. Pleasant school, and that such construction would pose a serious sewage disposal problem unless a sewer were provided.

A sewerage system has long been needed in this area. The soil conditions are such that there is little or no absorption. The water table is so near the surfact during the winter months that there  $\chi$  is an almost complete failure of individual disposal uhits, thereby creating a serious nuisance and health hazard.

It is our recommendation that unless proper disposal can be provided through a central sewerage system, that the city deny permits for additional construction in the area. We understand that steps are being taken to form a sanitary district in the Mt. Pleasant area, to finance sewer extensions. If we can be of service in helping the city to solve this problem, please feel free to call upon us.
