Ordinance No. 1465, an ordinance making a tax levy for Oregon City for the last six months of the year 1959 and the first six months of the year 1960 ending June 30, 1960, and declaring an emergency, was read the second time and on motion by Faust, seconded by Brown, placed on its final passage and it appearing from the certificate of Martha Barber, Principal Clerk of the Enterprise-Courier, that the same has been properly published as required by Charter, the ordinance was passed.

Proposed Ordinance No. 1467 was presented, and, in connection therewith, it was moved by Faust, seconded by Brown, that Ordinance No. 1467 be read the first time and ordered published.

ORDINANCE NO. 1467

An Ordinance providing for procedure without election to annex certain contiguous territory to Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon, fixing a day for public hearing before the Commission of Oregon City, on the question of such annexation, directing publication of notice of such hearing, and declaring an emergency.

Oregon City does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Tri-City Bowl, Inc., an Oregon Corporation, by Severin B. Harkson, President, and Douglas G. Jones, Secretary, on July 7, 1959, duly filed with the City Recorder its petition and consent for annexation of the following described real property situated in the County of Clackamas and State of Oregon, and which is contiguous to the present boundaries of Oregon City, to-wit:

A tract of land situated in Section 5, T. 3 S., R. 2 E., of the W.M., and being a part of the Samuel N. Vance D.L.C. No. 51, being more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a lead point at the intersection of the centerline of the Warner Milne Road and the Molalla Road which point bears 12.34 chains South and 37.00 chains East of the one-quarter section corner between Sections 5 and 6, T. 3 S., R. 2 E., of the W.M. From said place of beginning, thence West along the centerline of the Warner-Milne Road, 327.39 feet; thence leaving said centerline South 30.00 feet to an iron pipe in the southerly right of way line of said Warner Milne Road; thence continuing South 153.20 feet to an iron pipe; thence South 28°05' East parallel with said Molalla Road 250.00 feet to an iron pipe, thence North 61°55' East right angles to said Molalla Road 325.00 feet to an iron pipe; thence continuing North 61°55' East 50.00 feet to the centerline of said Molalla Road; thence North 28°05' West along said centerline of the Molalla Road 257.32 feet to the place of beginning. Subject to the rights of the Public in and to that portion within public road, in the County of Clackamas and State of Oregon.

Section 2. That the Commission of Oregon City does hereby elect to dispense with, and does hereby dispense with submitting the question of the annexation of said property to the registered voters of Oregon City and the Commission does hereby fix Wednesday, September 2, 1959, at 8:00 P.M. in the Commission Chambers in the City Hall at the corner of 7th and John Adams Streets, Oregon City, Oregon, as the time and place for a public hearing before the Commission of Oregon City, at which time and place the registered voters of Oregon City may appear and be heard on the question of such annexation.

Section 3. That the City Recorder cause notice of the time and place of said hearing to be published in the Enterprise-Courier, a newspaper of general circulation in Oregon City, once each week for two consecutive weeks prior to the said date fixed for said public hearing and said City Recorder be and she is further directed to post in four public places in Oregon City, written notices of said hearing and the time and place thereof for a like period of time.

Section 4. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of Oregon City, in this: That it is necessary that the date of said hearing be set promptly, therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Commission and approval by the Mayor.

Read first time and ordered published at an adjourned regular meeting of the Commission held on the 9th day of July, 1959, and to come up for second reading and final passage at a regular meeting of the Commission to be held on the 5th day of August, 1959, at the hour of 8:00 P.M.

RESOLUTION

Whereas, Oregon City has adopted Ordinance 1349, which provides by Section 13 thereof that the City Manager, subject to the approval of the City Commission by resolution, may designate stop streets, crosswalks, safety zones, traffic lanes, areas in which no parking shall be permitted and areas in which the time of parking is to be limited, install additional parking meters as required, the operation and use thereof to be governed by Ordinance No. 1326, and direct the placing and maintenance of such traffic signs, markers and signals as may be reasonable or necessary to carry the above powers into effect and also for the regulation and safety of traffic, and

Whereas, after careful study it has been determined that the following area requires traffic regulation,

Now therefore be it resolved by the City Commission of Oregon City that the City Manager be and he is hereby authorized and directed to designate the following as an area in which no parking shall be permitted at any time, to-wit:

Westerly side of Washington Street for a distance of 21 feet North of 12th Street to be marked by a yellow line.
