A sewerage system has long been needed in this area. The soil conditions are such that there is little or no absorption. The water table is so near the surfact during the winter months that there \varkappa is an almost complete failure of individual disposal units, thereby creating a serious nuisance and health hazard.

It is our recommendation that unless proper disposal can be provided through a central sewerage system, that the city deny permits for additional construction in the area. We understand that steps are being taken to form a sanitary district in the Mt. Pleasant area, to finance sewer extensions. If we can be of service in helping the city to solve this problem, please feel free to call upon us.
