A delegation of wood saw operators appeared before the commission requesting that the amount of the license be reduced. After due consideration the license was reduced from \$25.00 to \$10.00, per year,

The proposition was presented to the Commission regarding the donations to the Salvation Army. The County Court of Clackamas County agreed to donate \$50.00 provided the City of Oregon City and West Linn would make a donation of \$25.00 each, per month, on motion the City Recorder was authorized to make a payment of \$25.00 per month for the remainder of the year of 1934.

The City Commission was requested to make an interpretation of the rules regulating the material of which monuments or grave markers could be placed in the cemetery. On motion the interpretation of the paragraph on page 12 of regulations of the Mountain View Cemetery stating that no metal markers including bronze could be put in at the cemetery.

The following were appointed to prepare the budget for the year 1935: A. L. Beattie, William Andresen and W.G.H. Krueger.

On motion the following ordinance No. 1257 was read the first time and ordered published.

An Ordinance granting to Southern Pacific Company, its successors, lessees and assigns, as the successors in interest of Oregon and California Railroad Company, the right to continue to maintain and operate a side track on Center Street, Oregon City, from the southerly side of Abernethy Creek southerly to the north line of 15th street and to maintain a fill in Center Street between 15th Street and 16th Street, all as originally provided in Ordinance No. 451, approved September 8, 1909.

OREGON CITY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. THAT, WHEREAS, on September 1, 1909, there was passed by the Council of this City an Ordinance number 451, granting to the Oregon and California Railroad Company, its successors, lessees and assigns the right to construct, maintain and operate a side track in Center Street from a point in the main track of Oregon and California Railroad Company at the southerly end of the trestle across Abernethy Creek to the north line of 15th Street and the right to construct and maintain a fill in Center Street between 15th street and 16th street, and,

WHEREAS, Southern Pacific Company is the successor in interest of Oregon and California Railroad Company and has made application to the City Commission of the City of Oregon City for an extension of Ordinance No. 451 for a further period of 25 years from September 17, 1934, the date of expiration of said Ordinance No. 451.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, that Southern Pacific Company, its successors, lessees and assigns, be and it is hereby granted the right and privilege to continue to maintain and operate the said side track and fill in Center Street, together with the main track located on said fill, in the same manner and under the same conditions as provided in Ordinance No. 451 for a further period of 25 years from and after September 17, 1934.

Section 2. Said Southern Pacific Company shall within thirty days after the approval of this Ordinance, file in the office of the Recorder of the City of Oregon City, its written acceptance of this ordinance.

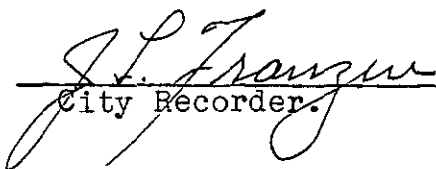
