#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Oregon City is now the owner of the following described real property, to-wit:

Situate in Clackamas County, State of Oregon, to-wit:

Beginning at a point in the center line of Eleventh Street which is 30 feet easterly from the westerly side of Grant Street, as noted on the plat of Central Addition to Oregon City, Oregon; thence running easterly on the center line of Eleventh Street if extended, 100.00 feet; thence northerly at right angles to Eleventh Street, 150.00 feet; thence westerly parallel with Eleventh Street if extended, 100.00 feet; thence southerly at right angles to Eleventh Street 150.00 feet to the place of beginning, being part of the Oregon City claim in Section 32, T.2 S.R. 2 E.
