The minutes of the previous meeting were continued to the next regular meeting of the Commission.

The City Recorder announced that the following persons have been informed of this Special City Commission meeting: Robert Hilliard, Editor, Enterprise-Courier; Sarah Wickman, The Oregonian; Janet Crisp, The Oregon Journal. The Recorder stated this was requested by the City Attorney as set forth in the new State Law on announcing public meetings.
