Ordinance #1354, an ordinance reducing all of the alley running through Block 44, Clackamas County Addition to Oregon City, according to the duly recorded plat thereof in Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon, between Taylor Street and Pierce Street from 26 feet in width to 12 feet in width in its entirety, was read the second time and on motion placed on its final passage, and it appearing from the certificate of Van Hoy O. Ballou, principal clerk of the publisher of the Oregon City Enterprise, that the same had been properly published as required by Charter, the ordinance was passed.

Police Chief MacDonald and Captain Newman appeared before the Commission in connection with the proposed new ordinance for licensing certain coin-operated machines. After some discussion the following ordinance was introduced and passed on first reading.

ORDINANCE No. 1355

An ordinance licensing the operation of certain coin operated machines and repealing Ordinance No. 1303.

OREGON CITY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: It shall be unlawful for any person, co-partnership or corporation within the City of Oregon City to have, operate, lease, place or permit to be operated or used or to have in his possession any coin operated machine without the payment of a license as herein provided.

Section 2: The license fee for each coin operated machine per year or any fraction thereof shall be as follows:

Section 3: For each and every machine so licensed as herein provided the license tag or sticker shall be affixed to said machine and any machine not carrying said license tag or sticker is subject to seizure by the Chief of Police of Oregon City.

Section 4: This ordinance shall not in any way be construed to permit the licensing or operation of any pihball game, dart game, or others games of like character as prohibited by ordinance proposed by initiative petition and passed by the electors of Oregon City on November 3, 1942.

Section 5: Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not exceeding \$300.00, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 6: That Ordinance No. 1303 be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 7: Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public, health, peace and safety of the City of Oregon City, in this: That there are a number of unlicensed devices operating in the City of Oregon City which require immediate regulation, therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its

passage by the City Commission and approval by the Mayor.

Read first time and ordered published at an adjourned regular meeting of the City Commission held on the 8th day of December, 1948, and to come up for second reading and final passage at a regular meeting of the City Commission to be held on the 5th day of January, 1949, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock p.m.

The City Manager brought up the subject of licensing electricians and was instructed to have an ordinance prepared for presentation at the next meeting; also to have an ordinance prepared on self-operating gas pumps.

Upon recommendation of the City Manager and the Police Chief the following resolutions were introduced and on motion adopted.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS Oregon City has adopted Ordinance No. 1349 which provides by paragraph (a) and (c) of Section 13 thereof that the City Manager, subject to the approval of the City Commission by resolution may

- (a) Designate stop streets.
- (c) Designate areas in which no parking shall be permitted and areas in which the time of parking is to be limited, and install additional parking meters as required, the operation and use thereof, to be governed by Ordinance No. 1326.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED That the City Manager be and he is hereby authorized and directed as follows:

To designate Holmes Lane as a stop street at its intersection with Linn Avenue

To designate Van Buren Street as a stop street at its intersection with 15th Street

To limit the time of parking such that no vehicle shall be permitted to park on any one block on 8th Street from Center Street to John Adams Street, on 6th Street from High Street to John Adams Street, on High Street from 7th Street to 5th Street, on Center Street, Washington Street and John Adams Street from 8th Street to 6th Street for a longer period than two (2) hours between the hours of 9:00 a. m. and 6:00 p. m. except on Sundays, New Years Day, Memorial Day, July 4, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas.

To install parking meters on the South side of 7th Street between High Street and Center Street.

To prohibit parking at all times on both sides of Division Street between 7th Street and Molalla Avenue.

WHEREAS considerable objection by the merchants in the neighborhood has been raised concerning the above mentioned restricted parking and

request has been made that parking be allowed on the South side of Division Street between 7th Street and Molalla Avenue,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED That the City Manager be and he is hereby authorized and directed as follows:

To disregard the prohibited parking at all times on both sides of Division Street as set forth above and to prohibit parking at all times on the North side of Division Street between 7th Street and Molalla Avenue.

Upon motion the City Manager was authorized to purchase a used street sweeper at \$1,200, to designate a loading zone for loading and unloading express shipments by individual citizens at the South Pacific Station.

The City Manager presented a request from the C. E. Stevens Outside Advertising Company for permission to install a sign on the unimproved portion of Ganong Street near Highway 99E in consideration of \$25.00 per year. After some discussion the request was denied.

The City Manager presented a petition from the citizens living in the Southeast portion of the City of which Molalla Avenue is the main street requesting the installation of the necessary trunk line and lateral sewers to serve their several districts. The Commission instructed the City Manager to make a study of the area for presentation at a future meeting.

Miss Pat Ryan and Dale Fowler of the Senior High School and Norman Peterson and Melvin Uptegrave of the Junior High School in the company of Ted Marletto, Recreation Director, and Kenneth Kerr, Assistant Director, appeared before the Commission at the request of the Mayor to discuss ways and means of correcting the drinking and rowdiness which occurs outside the Recreation Center during the course of the evening when dances are held. The above group of high school students promised to give the City administration every help they could in order to stop and abate this nuisance.

Mr. E. L. Baughman, President of the Planning Commission, appeared before the Commission and gave a favorable report of the work accomplished by the Planning Commission since its inception.

Mr. E. P. Buckman of Portland presented by letter the following proposition for garbage collection for Oregon City, The matter was laid on the table for future discussion.

Portland, Oregon December 4, 1948

To the City Manager and Members of the City Council Oregon City, Oregon

Gentlemen,

I have been investigating on my own behalf, the possibility of obtaining a contract with the City of Oregon City to operate the "Sanitary Service."

I therefore make the following proposal for your consideration in the near future.

That upon the experation of the present operator's contract I offer to pay the City \$500.00 annually for exclusive franchise to operate the garbage pickup service with the City limits of Oregon City.

I further agree furnish all first class equipment necessary for such operation, including a tracklaying tractor with blade to operate a sanitary fill in a satisfactory and agreeable location.

The rates for service to remain the same as at present.
