

A. King, Superintendent of the Oregon City Public Schools, for the installation of signals at the intersection of Molalla Avenue (route of the Cascade Secondary Highway) and 7th Street as a safety precaution for the school children who must cross Molalla Avenue going to and from school.

In its discussion of this matter the Commission had the benefit of a report from the State Highway Engineer based on investigation of conditions existing at this location. As a result of the discussion the Commission unanimously approved the installation of an overhead illuminated crosswalk sign at an estimated cost of \$700, on the condition that the City of Oregon City will pay one-half of the expense, or approximately \$350.

Will you please advise me whether or not the City is willing to cooperate in this installation to such an extent. If the City's reaction is favorable the matter will be covered by an appropriate agreement which will be prepared in this office and forwarded to the City for execution.
