

Mr. Fred H. Schultz appeared before the Commission. He stated that he was having trouble with vandalism in his house. He stated that the Police Department did not do anything about it, but that he wished to know what could be done. It was explained to the Commission by the Manager that he had talked to Mr. Schultz and also the Police Department regarding the matter and that Mr. Schultz would not list his stolen goods nor tell the Police Department who he thought the individuals were nor did he sign a complaint. The City Attorney asked Mr. Schultz if he would come down to his office the next day and sign a complaint on which the City could act. Mr. Schultz agreed.

Mr. Ralph Guynes was present and requested the Commission to give consideration to selling the balance of the property of which they just vacated one half. He stated that he had been in conference with the City Manager, Street Superintendent, and City Engineer in trying to figure out what to do with the City owned portion. No one was able to come up with a solution to the problem. The Commission agreed to accept sealed bids for the property and it was moved by Laurs, seconded by Brown that the property be put up for sale, advertised, and sealed bids be accepted on February 21, 1957 at 1:00 P.M.

Rev. Howard Hutchins was present and stated that he wished to have a short street opened just off of Promontory Avenue. He stated that it was a problem for cars to turn around when it was congested. The Manager explained that the proper procedure was for the people affected to bear the cost of opening and that then the City would oil the street free of charge. Rev. Hutchins also stated his objections to the vacation of Promontory Avenue which the Commission now has under advisement as a result of the petition requesting vacation. He stated that it was the only desirable view point left in Oregon City. The Commission agreed to meet Mr. Hutchins to look into the two properties in question on February 19 at 1:00 P.M.

The Manager brought up the question of the pin for past Mayors and asked the Commission whether or not they desired the stone to be a diamond or ruby. The cost of the diamond would be approximately \$30 and that of the ruby approximately \$18. The Commission agreed that the Manager should obtain the diamond stone for the pins.

Mayor Helzer stated that he had requested the resignation of Jack Lynch of the Planning Commission by reason that he had not attended the Planning Commission meeting of late and also that there were now three members living outside the City limits whereas only two were allowed, therefore, he submitted the name of Roy Stafford to serve out the term of Jack Lynch. It was moved by Laurs, seconded by Brown that Roy Stafford be approved for the unexpired term of Jack Lynch.

Nays: None.

Mayor Helzer stated also that he wished to submit the names of members of the Singer Hill study Committee. The following names were presented: Ralph Guynes, Raymond Caulfield, Dr. E. H. McLean, Clarence Swedlund, and Roy Stafford.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned to meet again on February 11, 1957 at 1:00 P.M.
