Whereas, public necessity and the general welfare of Oregon City require changes in certain districts, which changes have been referred to the City Planning Commission and approved by them after public notice and hearing as required by Title XI, Chapter 17, Section 2, of the 1963 City Code, and the City Commission after public notice and hearing finding that a need exists for commercial zoning, that this zoning is compatible with the comprehensive plan, and that no opposition has appeared, the following described property in Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon, to-wit:

A tract of land being a part of the William Holmes D.L.C. No. 38 in Section 5, T.3S., R.2E., of the W.M., and being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a one-half (1/2) inch iron pipe in the northeasterly boundary of the Oregon City-Molalla Road, State Highway No. 213, said iron pipe being S. 61°51'00" W. 761.10 ft. from the S.W. corner of Lot 14, Gales Park, a townplat recorded in Book 11, on page 28, Record of Townplats for Clackamas County, State of Oregon; thence N. 29°09'00" W. 322.02 ft. to an iron pipe; thence N. 61°51'00" E. 460.0 ft. to a point, said point being the N.E. corner of that tract of land conveyed to Clackamas County, for street purposes, recorded in Deed Book 431, page 386; thence S.28°09'00" E. 342.02 ft. to a point; thence S. 61°51'00" W. 460.0 ft. to a point, said point being on the northeasterly boundary of the Oregon City-Molalla Road, State Highway No. 213; thence N. 28°09'00" W. 20 ft. to the true point of beginning, excluding that westerly portion of the above described tract which lay within the City of Oregon City prior to Portland Metropolitan Area Local Government Boundary Commission Order dated December 12, 1973, and except that portion lying within public roads.
