An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor and Recorder of Oregon City, Oregon, to enter into a contract with the City of Gladstone for the treatment of their sewage in the Oregon City sewage treatment plant and declaring an emergency.

OREGON CITY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Recorder of Oregon City be and they are hereby authorized and directed to execute a contract with the City of Gladstone for the treatment of the latter's sewage in the Oregon City sewage treatment plant in accordance with the terms thereof which contract is dated March 4, 1953 and was filed with the Recorder on March 5, 1953.

Section 2. Inasmuch as this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation and peace, public health and safety of Oregon City in this: That it is necessary that said contract be executed immediately so that Gladstone may make prompt and suitable arrangements for the disposition of its sewage, therefore an emergency is declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Commission and approval by the Mayor.

Read first time and ordered published at an adjourned regular meeting of the Commission held on the 11th day of March, 1953 and to come up for second reading and final passage at a regular meeting of the Commission to be held on the 1st day of April, 1953 at the hour of 8:00 P.M.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 4th day of March, 1953 by and between Oregon City, a municipal corporation of the State of Oregon, Party of the first part, and the City of Gladstone, a municipal corporation of the State of Oregon, Party of the second part, hereinafter referred to as Gladstone, witnesseth:

THAT whereas Oregon City is constructing a sewage treatment plant on a portion of its property at the confluence of the Willamette River and the Clackamas River, and

WHEREAS said sewage treatment plant will have a capacity in excess of the present requirements of Oregon City for the use thereof, and

WHEREAS Gladstone desires to connect its sanitary sewerage system with Oregon City's sewage treatment plant and treat the same thereat, now therefore.

In consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements, terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, the parties hereto do hereby agree, each with the other, as follows:

- 1. Oregon City, subject to the terms, conditions and provisions hereof, agrees to receive unto its sewage treatment plant at said plant, sewage from the sanitary sewerage system of Gladstone at a maximum rate of 1,000 gallons per minute and to treat such sewage in the same manner as it shall treat sewage from Oregon City.

 2. For the services stated in Paragraph 1, Gladstone agrees to make payment as follows:
 - (a) Gladstone agrees to pay Oregon City annually in advance on the 1st day of March, the lump sum of \$3,000.00 per year, the payment of which fee (plus semi-annual payments outlined hereafter) shall entitle Gladstone to rights to the treatment of sewage up to a maximum rate of 1,000 gallons per minute.

 (b) Gladstone agrees to pay Oregon City semi-annually, upon receipt of statement from Oregon City, the sum of \$15.00 per 1,000,000 gallons of sewage treated, with a minimum guarantee to Oregon City of \$2,000.00 per year, unless said semi-annual payments are re-negotiated as hereinafter set forth.
- 3. It is understood and agreed and it is a condition of this agreement that,
 - (a) Gladstone will at its own cost and expense provide the connection with the Oregon City Sewage Treatment Plant and install the appropriate valves and devices at its pumping plant for shredding its sewage and shall maintain and operate the same in good working order.
 - (b) Gladstone shall impose and enforce the same regulations on its users as to the character of sewage to be accepted into the sewer system as are now, or in the future may be, imposed upon the users of Oregon City.
- 4. Gladstone shall annually make adequate and appropriate provisions in its budget to meet its financial requirements payable to Oregon City, and shall make all payments to Oregon City as herein provided for, promptly and when due on March 1 and September 1 of each year.

- 5. Oregon City agrees to perform and carry out the terms and provisions hereof and treat the sewage received from Gladstone in the same manner as its and other sewage delivered thereto and in good faith, operate its said treatment plant to the end that all sewage delivered thereto shall be treated so as to fully comply with all the requirements of law and the regulations of the Oregon State Sanitary Authority and other State agencies having jurisdiction thereof, and further agrees that all proper officials of Gladstone shall have access to said.plant and the meter and the meter records at all times.
- 6. In the event that Oregon City shall, on account of the act or negligence of Gladstone, breakage or damage to plant equipment or facilities, vandalism, war, riot, or invasion, defect in sewage treatment plant by fire or other casualty, governmental restriction, regulations or prohibition, strikes, inability to procure supplies, material or labor, patent infringement, weather, Act of God, or causes beyond its control, be unable to comply with any of the provisions hereof, wholly or in part, Oregon City shall not be held liable to Gladstone for any loss, damage, or any breach of this agreement on account thereof.

7. It is also agreed that Oregon City may at any time and without being deemed to violate any of the provisions hereof, temporarily refuse to accept sewage for treatment hereunder or treat same without being liable to Gladstone for any breach of this agreement on account thereof if Oregon City shall, for purposes of repairs, new

construction, replacements or additions to equipment or facilities, or for any other reason arising out of the operation of said treatment plant, deem the same necessary, but all of said repairs or re-

placements shall be made promptly.

8. In the event said sewage treatment plant is out of operation for any reason including those enumerated in Sections 6 and 7 for over 30 days then credit shall be given Gladstone on said semiannual payments for all time said plant is out of operation over said 30 day period of \$5.50 per day. If the State Sanitary Authority permits the sewage from the plant to go directly into the Willamette River without treatment the plant shall be construed to be in operation. 9. The term of this agreement shall be for twenty years, with the option to re-negotiate at the end of that time for another agreement. The amount of semi-annual payment, however, under this agreement shall be re-negotiated on the 5th, 10th and 15th year hereafter. In the event the parties herein are unable to agree at any of said renegotiation periods then the amount of said semi-annual payment in effect at that time shall continue, it being agreed that the \$3,000.00 annual fee shall not be re-negotiated during the full term of this agreement.

10. This agreement shall be effective upon the construction by Gladstone of a connection to the Oregon City Sewage treatment plant. In the event that Gladstone shall fail to connect to the Oregon City Sewage treatment plant within one year from the date the Oregon City Sewage treatment plant is completed, then this agreement shall be deemed ineffective for any purpose and not binding upon either of the

parties hereto.

11. In the event Gladstone shall fail or neglect to make payment to Oregon City of any amounts payable, at the times and as herein provided, and such default shall continue for 90 days after the payment date thereof, and also in the event Gladstone shall be in default herein for its failure or neglect to perform, or observe or comply with any of the other terms and provisions hereof to be performed, observed or complied with by it, and such default shall continue for 30 days after written notice thereof given by Oregon City to Gladstone, then and in any such events Oregon City may, at its option, declare this agreement terminated and at an end.
