WHEREAS, There has been filed with the City Commission of Oregon City, Oregon, a petition for vacation of the following described real property:

RESOLUTION

IN THE CITY COMMISSION OF OREGON CITY STATE OF OREGON, COUNTY OF CLACKAMAS

In the Matter of Creating)
the Oregon City Civil)
Defense Agency)

WHEREAS, the increasing possibility of disasters resulting from enemy attack, sabotage or other hostile action, fire and flood or other causes, and in order to insure that preparations of this city will be adequate to deal with such disasters and to protect the public peace, health and safety; and

WHEREAS, under Oregon Revised Statutes 401, known as the "Oregon Civil Defense Act of 1949, as amended," each political subdivision is authorized and directed to establish a local organization for civil defense in accordance with the State Civil Defense Plan and Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is ordered that:

- 1. A local organization for civil defense in Oregon City be and the same is hereby established to be known as the "Oregon City Civil Defense Agency" to perform such civil defense functions within and outside the territorial limits of Oregon City as provided by the Oregon Civil Defense Act of 1949, as amended.
- 2. The Oregon City Civil Defense Agency shall have a Director who shall be appointed by the City Commission to serve at its pleasure. The Director shall have the duties and powers provided in said Oregon Civil Defense Act of 1949, as amended, and shall have direct responsibility for the organization, administration and operation of said agency, subject to the direction and control of said City Commission.
- 3. The Director of Oregon City Civil Defnese Agency will make maximum use of existing facilities and services. Upon request of the Director, the City Commission will issue the necessary letter of instructions to expand the functions of any existing City facility or service so as to include civil defense activities. The duties of the head of any existing City facility or service shall with this order include civil defense responsibilities.
- 4. After taking into consideration the qualification necessary of the individual to be selected for appointment as Director, it is the best interest of Oregon City, that Stanley J. Orzechowski be appointed Director Oregon City Civil Defense Agency.
