## SPECIAL MEETING

The City Commission met in special session on the above date in the office of the City Manager at the City Hall at 8:00 o'clock p.m.

Roll call showed the following present:

Raymond P. Caufield, Mayor Albert Roake, Commissioner Richard W. Long, Commissioner Alden Miller, City Attorney Robert A. Finlayson, City Manager

Ordinance No. 1359, an Ordinance declaring any unoccupied vehicle parked upon a public street of Oregon City in violation of an Ordinance of Oregon City to be an obstruction therein and a public nuisance, and providing for the removal thereof, and declaring an emergency, was read the second time and on motion placed on its final passage, and it appearing from the certificate of Van Hoy O. Ballou, principal clerk of the publisher of the Oregon City Enterprise, that the same had been properly published as required by Charter, the ordinance was passed.

Ayes, Caufield, Roake and Long Nays: None

Upon motion a special meeting of the Commission was set for 5:00 o'clock p.m., Friday, April 22.

Upon motion the City Attorney was requested to prepare a resolution to be considered at the special meeting on April 22 placing the city employees on daylight saving time.

The City Manager presented a petition signed by 23 residents of the neighborhood on the other side of the canyon that stops Twelfth Street beyond Taylor Street. The petitioners had met with the Commission at the Buena Vista Club House on Friday, April 8 and requested the Commission upon their own motion to place on the ballot at the special election to be held this spring a measure asking the citizens to vote a fund of \$21,000 for three years to build a Twelfth Street bridge. Upon motion the City Attorney was requested to prepare and present at the special meeting on April 22 the necessary resolution to place the requested measure on the ballot.

The City Manager read the following letter addressed to the Commission and City Manager:

The City Manager brought up the matter of the V. F. W. petition requesting the appointment of a boxing commission with the request from Elvion Morgan, past Commander of V.F.W., who had presented the petition, that the matter be tabled for the present. Upon motion the petition was tabled.
