The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mayor Laurs then asked for remarks regarding the vacation of a portion of Main Street and a portion of Fourth Street from anyone present.

A large number of those present spoke in favor of the vacation. After considerable discussion and there being no opposition, the Mayor entertained a motion for the vacation of the street as requested upon the payment of \$25,000. It was moved by Brown, seconded by Faust, that the City accept \$25,000 in payment and that Ordinance No. 1458 be read the first time and ordered published.

ORDINANCE NO. 1458

An ordinance vacating a portion of Main Street and a portion of Fourth Street in the plat of Oregon City, Oregon, herein more particularly described.

WHEREAS, it appears to the Commission of Oregon City, Oregon, that on the 10th day of February, 1959, a Resolution was duly adopted initiating action for the vacation of portions of Main Street and Fourth Street in Oregon City, hereinafter described and thereafter the City Recorder caused Notice to be given by posting and publication as required by law and that proof of said posting and publication is on file with the City Recorder and that the matter of said vacation, together with a hearing of any objections or claims to be heard and considered concerning said vacation of said portions of said streets would be heard and considered at 7:00 o'clock P.M. on the 10th day of April, 1959, in the Commission meeting room at the City Hall in Oregon City, Oregon, and said hearing having been held and it appearing that said vacation is in the public interest and that all expenses and assessments in connection therewith have been paid, now therefore,

OREGON CITY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the following described portions of Main Street and Fourth Street in Oregon City, Oregon, to-wit:

Beginning at the most southerly corner of Block 1 said plat, thence northeasterly along the northwesterly line of Main Street to the northeasterly corner of Block 2, thence northwesterly along the northeasterly boundary of Block 2 to the most northerly corner of said Block 2, thence northeasterly along the northeasterly extension of the northwesterly line of Block 2 to the most westerly corner of Block 3, thence Southeasterly along the southwesterly boundary of Block 3 and the Southeasterly extension thereof to the southeasterly line of Main Street, said plat, thence southwesterly along the southeasterly line of Main Street to the intersection of said southeasterly line with the southeasterly extension of the southwesterly line of said Block 1, thence Northwesterly to the place of beginning all within the corporate limits of said city,

be and the same are hereby vacated, subject to the reservations set forth in Section 2 hereof.

2. There is hereby reserved through and across said vacated area, a right and easement for the maintenance by Oregon City of water and sewer lines. There is also reserved from said vacation, the right of utility companies to maintain electrical lines. Said vacation is further subject to a right of the Portland Traction Company, its successors and assigns, to maintain tracks in and upon said vacated area for so long as said company, its successors and assigns, holds a franchise from Oregon City, over the unvacated portion of Main Street adjacent to the vacated area.

Read first time and ordered published at an adjourned regular meeting of the Commission held on the 10th day of April, 1959, and to come up for second reading and final passage at an adjourned regular meeting of the Commission to be held on the 22nd day of April, 1959, at the hour of 7:30 o'clock P.M.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made on this 10th day of April, 1959, by and between PUBLISHERS' PAPER CO., a corporation, hereafter called "Publishers'" and OREGON CITY, a municipal corporation, hereafter called "City".

The circumstances of this agreement are that a portion of Main Street in Oregon City between Blocks 1 and 2 and 28 and 29 in the plat of Oregon City and also portions of Main Street opposite the vacated portions of Third Street and Fourth Street in said City, have been vacated and are now the property of Publishers'. The vacated portion of Main Street has been used by some residents of the City as a pedestrian walk-way. Publishers' is willing to permit pedestrians to walk across its premises from the old Territorial Road at the end of Blocks 1 and 2 to the public portion of Main Street at the southwesterly end of Block 3 in said City.

It is therefore agreed between the parties that Publishers' will allow members of the public to cross its premises on foot from the southwesterly end of Main Street at the southwesterly end of Block 1 in the City to the southwesterly end of the public portion of Main Street at the southwesterly end of Block 3 in the City for a period of five years from date hereof. Publishers' reserves the right under this permit to designate the location of such walk-way if it so desires.

It is agreed between the parties hereto that this agreement may be extended for additional periods of five years upon its expiration at the option of the City. The extension of the agreement shall be identical to this one, unless otherwise agreed between the parties and shall include a right to further extend the walk-way permit herein provided for, for an additional five years and future agreements shall also provide for continuous extensions at the option of the City.

The City's option to renew and extend this agreement for five year periods shall be deemed to be automatically exercised unless the City notifies Publishers' in writing that it does not wish to extend this agreement.

The consideration for this agreement is \$1.00 paid by Oregon City to Publishers', receipt whereof is acknowledged by Publishers'.
