BE IT RESOLVED by the City Commission of Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon, that the following proposed Ordinance No. 1679 be and the same is hereby proposed for submission to the legal voters of Oregon City at a special City election to be held as in this Resolution provided.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY COMMISSION TO INCLUDE IN THE BUDGET AND LEVY THE SUM OF \$203,958.00, WHICH, EXPRESSED AS A RATE OF LEVY, IS ESTIMATED AT \$2.66 PER THOUSAND DOLLARS OF TRUE CASH VALUE OF TAXABLE PROPERTY IN OREGON CITY, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1969-1970 FOR GENERAL CITY PURPOSES WHICH AMOUNT EXCEEDS THE CONSTITUTIONAL 6% LIMITATION SET FORTH IN ARTICLE XI, SECTION 11 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF OREGON AND IS IN ADDITION TO ALL OTHER TAXES LEVIED.

OREGON CITY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Commission be and it is hereby authorized and directed to include in the budget and levy the sum of \$203,958.00 which, expressed as a rate of levy, is estimated at \$2.66 per thousand dollars of true cash value of taxable property in Oregon City, for the fiscal year 1969-70 for general city purposes which sum exceeds the 6% limitation as set forth in Article XI, Section 11 of the Constitution of Oregon which shall be in addition to all other taxes levied.

Read first time and ordered submitted to the legal voters of Oregon City for their approval or rejection at the special city election to be held on the 10th day of June, 1969.
