ADJOURNED REGULAR MEETING

An adjourned regular meeting of the City Commission was held on the above date in the Commission Chambers at City Hall at 8:00 p.m.

Roll call showed the following present:

The Mayor called the meeting to order and asked for approval of the minutes of the May 3, 1978 meeting.

Commissioner Woolsey stated that on page 587, first paragraph, it was her understanding that a document of conditions for the loan of the wagon be written and signed and agreed to. The Attorney stated they were to write a letter of indemnity.

The minutes of the May 3, 1978 meeting were approved as published.

This was the time for citizens to present items for Commission consideration. There was no input from those in the audience.

Mayor Nichols presented an item for Commission consideration. He reported that the Commission has been asked to pass a resolution supporting the Town Meeting on June 24. Discussion was held on the proposed resolution and possible financial contribution from the City. Commissioner Andrew felt the Commission should wait for the request for financial assistance and then a resolution would be in order. Following discussion, it was moved by Woolsey, seconded by Allick, that the City Commission request City staff to prepare a resolution in support of Oregon City Town Meeting '78 for the next meeting.

Commissioner Andrew expressed his concern on the repair of the water break at 7th and Madison Streets and the fact that users of water in that area weren't notified of the turn-off. Bill Jackson, Water Superintendent, explained that this was an employee error in an emergency situation.

The Commission was presented a drawing of the easement to be released to Milton Brandt at Linn Avenue and Singer Creek Park. It was moved by McKnight, seconded by Woolsey, to authorize the release of the easement as prepared and that the Mayor and the City Recorder be authorized to sign.

RESOLUTION NO. 78-10

A RESOLUTION CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION FOR SUBMISSION TO THE VOTERS OF OREGON CITY OF A PROPOSAL AUTHORIZING THE CITY COMMISSION OF OREGON CITY TO LEVY A TAX IN EXCESS OF THE 6% CONSTITUTIONAL LIMITATION OVER AND ABOVE ALL OTHER TAXES NOW AUTHORIZED TO BE LEVIED BY OREGON CITY AND AS RECOMMENDED BY THE BUDGET COMMITTEE.

WHEREAS, in order to continue the business of Oregon City in an efficient manner and to the same extent as in the past, and further to function as in the past as a municipal corporation, and to provide adequate police and fire protection, necessary personnel and salaries, and to provide the citizens of Oregon City with other necessary services due to the increase of the territory, industry and population of Oregon City, it is necessary that a levy of taxes on property in excess of the 6% limitation provided by the Constitution of the State of Oregon and the laws of this State be imposed to meet the expense created thereby; and

WHEREAS, the budget as recommended by the Budget Committee of Oregon City and approved by the City Commission has determined that the sum of \$1,488,110 in excess of and over and above the amount and limits established by the Constitution and laws of the State of Oregon and in excess of the amount of Oregon City is now authorized to levy as an ad valorem tax on real property without approval of the voters of Oregon City is necessary for the purposes above mentioned;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Commission of Oregon City as follows:

1. A special election is hereby called to be held in Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon, on Tuesday, the 20th day of June, 1978, at which time there will be six polling places where all the voters of the City may vote. Said polling places shall be:

- 2. There shall be submitted to the qualified voters of Oregon City at such special election the question of whether or not Oregon City shall levy a tax in the sum of \$1,488,110 in excess of the 6% limitation fixed by Section II, Article XI, of the Oregon Constitution for the fiscal year 1978-79.

Shall Oregon City be authorized to levy for the fiscal year 1978-79 the sum of \$1,488,110 outside the limitation set forth in SEction 11, Article XI, of the Oregon Constitution? If this proposal is approved, the operating budget to be financed by local taxes for the fiscal year 1978-79 will be \$313,593 more than the operating budget financed by local taxes for the preceding year.

EXPLANATION OF THE BALLOT QUESTION

This is not a new tax; it replaces the levy voters approved last year.

The purpose of the levy is to provide funds to pay for adequate police and fire protection and other services of the City.

The levy includes \$260,970 for Street Department Maintenance and Improvements.

The regular meeting of the City Commission was held on the above date in the Commission Chambers at City Hall at $8:00\ p.m.$

Roll call showed the following present:

Mayor Nichols called for approval of the May 11, 1978 minutes. As there were no additions or corrections to the minutes, the Mayor announced that they stand approved as published.

This was the time for citizens to present items for Commission consideration. There was no input from the audience.

The Commission held discussion on proposed Ordinance No. 1905 which was scheduled for second reading. The Manager informed the Commission that this ordinance will not go into effect for 30 days since one Commissioner is absent from this meeting.

Commissioner Woolsey stated she had two objections: Under variances, 10-8-5, design, style, value and age are secondary to traffic safety. She stated it stresses flow of traffic to higher degree of livability. Her second objection is to Section 2 where setback requirements do not comply with what is already in City Code.

Proposed Ordinance No. 1905, an Ordinance amending Title X: Traffic, of the 1963 City Code, by adding Chapter 8: Traffic Sight Obstruction; and Title XI: Zoning, Chapter 3, Section 4: Area Exceptions by amending Subsection (K) and adding Subsection (L), and declaring an emergency, was read the second time and on motion by Andrew, seconded by Allick, placed on its final passage and, it appearing from the certificate of Kristi Busch, Principal Clerk of the Enterprise-Courier, that the same has been properly published as required by Charter, the Ordinance was passed.

The City Manager stated that City staff would not recommend releasing the retainage at this time since there are outstanding bills against the project. The City Attorney informed the Commission that ARticle XII of the Charter, passed by initiative of the people, provides that any property designated as park property by the City or given to the City as park property must be approved for sale by a vote of the people. Commissioner Allick stated that, if this is to be sold, it would have to be sold by bid.

The Commission was presented recommendations from the Traffic Safety Board.

It was moved by Allick, seconded by Andrew, to accept the recommendation of the Traffic Safety Board on "No Left Turn" at Tumwater Drive and 99E, and that the Attorney be instructed to prepare the necessary resolution.

It was moved by Andrew, seconded by Allick, to continue discussion on the proposed extension and improvement of Center Street to the June 15 meeting. Motion and second were withdrawn.

Discussion was held on the proposed extension of Center Street and the time element involved. The Planning Commission recommendation was presented to the Commission as follows:

"It was moved by Koppang, seconded by Ramsour, that the Planning Commisson recommend that Center Street be extended as a through street; that City participation in the cost be at the option of the City Commission; that further analysis be done regarding the intersection of South Second and High Streets; and that Clinton Street become a dead-end road. Ayes: 8. Nays: 0. Motion carried."

Memos from the Police Chief and the City Planner were presented recommending the extension of Center Street.

A representative of Nordic Construction, contractors, was present and explained their plans.

The City Planner informed the Commission that residents from the bottom of the hill to 5th Street had been notified of the Planning Commission hearing, and that all testimony consisted of one person saying he was in favor of the extension of Center Street.

Following a lengthy discussion, it was moved by Andrew, seconded by Allick, to adopt the recommendation of the Planning Commission for the extension of Center Street.

The Commission was informed of the letter to apply for Traffic Enforcement Grant which had previously been approved by the Commission. Commissioner Woolsey requested that it be noted there is a change in the amount.

The Traffic Safety recommendation to prohibit left turns north-bound on Washington Street from east-bound traffic on 7th Street, was, on motion by Woolsey, seconded by Allick, referred to staff for their recommendation.

The Traffic Safety recommendation to establish "No Right Turn on Red" east-bound on Pearl Street at Molalla Avenue, was, on motion by Woolsey, seconded by Allick, referred to staff for their recommendation.

The Manager explained the emergency situation at Clackamette Park rest rooms and presented a memo from the City Engineer, listing the following quotations on the installation of a pump station:

Hydronix, Inc. - Hydr-O-Matic pump with recessed impeller \$2,705.00 - Hydr-O-Matic sphere-handling pump \$2,613.00

Queen Pump Co. - Flygt pump

\$2,487.00

The Engineer recommended: accepting the low bid of Queen Pump Co. in the amount of \$2,487.00, plus City-purchased material in the amount of \$1,248.00, making a total installation cost of \$3,735.00.

It was moved by Woolsey, seconded by Allick, to accept the recommendation of the City Engineer and to authorize the purchase of the Flygt pump from Queen Pump Co. in the amount of \$2,487.00.

A letter was presented from H & A Construction Co., proposing to furnish material and labor to construct the exterior basketball court at the Multi-Purpose Building for the sum of \$5,630.00. The City Manager explained that funds are available and that this is minority participation in the EDA project and recommended approval. It was moved by Andrew, seconded by Allick, that the change work order for the Multi-Purpose Building exterior basketball court be approved.

A letter was presented from Mrs. Josephine Courtney with a contribution of \$50.00 to the new Senior Center in memory of her husband, Earle Courtney. It was moved by Woolsey, seconded by Allick, that an appropriate letter of recognition and thanks go forth from this Commission to Mrs. Josephine Courtney.

The Commission was presented a request for the purchase of a 1978 vehicle to serve recreational needs of the community. Memos were presented from the City Recorder and the City Manager explaining the transfer of City-owned vehicles to the Sewage, Police and Recreation Departments, with the purchase of the new vehicle for the Engineering Department.

After considerable discussion, it was moved by Allick, seconded by Andrew, to give the City Administration permission to purchase a 1978 vehicle, in the amount of \$4,940.22, from McKee Pontiac, as per their quotation as listed in the Manager's memo.

The Commission was informed of a joint meeting of the Tri-City councils and staff with members of the Board of County Commissioners on June 8, 1978,7:30 p.m., for presentation of the report by the consulting engineers and discussion.
