Mr. James Blair presented a petition requesting that the 15th Street roadway from Harrison to Division be widened from 20 feet to 40 feet and the cost be assessed against the property owners. Messrs. Virgil W. Beetham and C. J. Gray in the name of the Parking Meter Advertising Company appeared before the Commission requesting a franchise from the City to place a triangular arrangement of advertising panels to the parking meter standard. The City to receive a certain percentage of the gross sales of the advertisement. Upon motion the men were requested to take the matter up with the Retail Trades Commission and if approved by them, the Commission would give serious consideration to their proposal.

Dear Sirs:

At the last meeting of the Recreation Committee held on Wednesday, April 27, 1949, the matter of a nominal charge in connection with the use of the swimming tank facilities was considered.

Throughout the summer months, two-life-guards and two bath-house attendants are employed with a consequent drain on the budget of the Recreation Department. With the installation of the new bath-house, the people partronizing the pool now have a place to check their clothing and take adequate showers. It seem to the Committee, and it went on record as being in favor of the adoption of a policy of charge in connection with the use of these facilities.

Specifically, the recommendation is that each person attending the pool be required to check their clothing and to pay a nominal charge of not in excess of 10¢ with provision being made for omitting the charge in case of those individuals who are indigent. Proof of their want of funds could be handled through a letter from the County Welfare Department, or some similar agency.

This is a splendid recreation facility offered to the people of Oregon City, and as you know also, to the people outside the limits of Oregon City. It was felt that no one could complain of a charge such as is suggested in this letter. We pass this recommendation on to you with our approval, and request that you notify us of whatever action you take.
