RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the offices of City Recorder and Treasurer are now filled by separate individuals, and

WHEREAS, the duties of the two offices are similar, and

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Commission it is more advantageous to the City and will simplify the work and result in less expense to the City if the two offices are combined, and

WHEREAS, the Charter provides that the Commission may by resolution require any officer to perform the duties of two or more offices without additional compensation.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the duties of City Recorder and Treasurer be combined in the office of the City Recorder, effective July 1, 1949.
