

The City Manager presented an outline for the re-modeling of the cemetery residence at 937 Molalla Avenue. He presented an outline by Delta Construction Company for the re-modeling in the amount of \$4000.00. After discussion, the City Commission said that they would look at the house and take the re-modeling under consideration.

Albert F. Hockett, manager of the Oregon City Taxi Service, was present to request a fare increase for his cab service. He stated in his application to "shorten the distance of our present 50¢ minimum fare and increase all other zones approximately 10¢ according to mileage." It was moved by Commissioner Laurs, seconded by Commissioner Helzer that the request be granted and that Mr. Hockett be filed the new fare rate with the City Recorder and the same be published in the newspaper.

Cliff Beckett was appointed to be Municipal Judge Pro-tem by the City Commission.
