Mrs. Leola Patton, Mr. Kenneth Hess, Mr. W.M. Brunell, Mr. S. W. Taylor, Mrs. E. Mills, Mr. Lester Lancaster, Mrs. W. M. Brunell, Mr. Ora Patton, a group of Citizens living on Irving Street, Just off of Pearl, appeared before the Commission requesting that an ordinance be passed or something be done to restrain a Mr. Wilkerson, living in the same neighborhood, from maintaining a large Deisel Logging Truck along side of his home. The group claimed that Mr. Wilkerson was in the habit of starting the engine of the truck in the early hours of the morning and letting it run to warm it up, thus creating a nuisance by the noise and fumes from the engine. The matter was discussed at great length and during the discussion it was brought out that Mr. Wilkerson was awaiting trial on a charge of creating a nuisance with his truck. The Commission took no action but did inform the group that they would await the out come of the trial and in the meantime a study would be made to see what legal action could be taken to abate the noise and fumes.

Jack Caldwell appeared before the Commission requesting that that portion of Brighton Avenue from where the pavement ends to the corner of Charman Street be improved as an all-weather road. After some discussion it was pointed out to Mr. Caldwell that the cost of the improvement was a responsibility of the individual property owners and the request was denied. Mr. Caldwell then requested that he be given an estimate of the cost of improving said portion of Brighton Avenue and he would endeavor to collect the funds from the property owners. The City Manager was instructed to make the necessary estimate.

The City Manager brought up the matter of two hour parking on the South side of Fifth Street between Center and Washington Street and in Connection therewith the following resolution was read and upon motion adopted and passed:

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, Oregon City has adopted Ordinance 1349 which provides by paragraph (c) of Section 13 thereof that the City Manager, subject to the approval of the City Commission by resolution, may designate areas in which no parking is permitted.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Commission of Oregon City that the City Manager be and he is hereby authorized and directed to designate the following as areas in which parking shall be limited, to-wit:..

Two hour parking on the Southerly side of Fifth Street between Center Street and Washington Street.

ORDINANCE NO. 1388

An Ordinance providing for the issuance and sale of \$175,000.00 of general obligation bonds of Oregon City authorized by the charter amendment designated as Chapter VIII-C adopted by the legal voters of Oregon City at a special City election on May 16, 1952, and declaring an emergency.

OREGON CITY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That there shall be issued and sold as soon as may be practicable, and as provided by law, \$175,000.00 par value of Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon, general obligation bonds, dated November 1, 1952, numbered consecutively from 1 to 175, inclusive, to bear interest at a rate or rates of not to exceed six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on May 1 and November 1 of each year, with principal and interest payable in lawful money of the United States of America, to be negotiable in form with appropriate interest coupons attached and to be in denominations of \$1,000.00 each. Said bonds shall mature serially in numerical order at the rate of \$12,000.00 on the 1st day of November in each of the years 1953 to 1966 inclusive, and \$7,000.00 on November 1, 1967, however, any of said bonds shall be callable for the payment of principal at the option of Oregon City upon any interest payment date on or after November 1, 1962. The principal and interest of said bonds shall be payable at the office of the Treasurer of Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon.

Said bonds and coupons attached thereto shall be in substantially the following forms:

lawful money of the United States of America on the 1st day of November, 19__, with interest thereon from the date hereof at the rate of ____ per cent (____%) per annum, payable semi-annually on the 1st days of May and November of each year, on the presentation and surrender of the annexed interest coupons as they severally become due. Both principal and interest of this bond are hereby made payable at the office of the Treasurer of Oregon City, Oregon.

This bond is one of a series amounting in the aggregate to the sum of One Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000.00), par value, issued for the purpose of providing funds for constructing, equipping, and maintaining a municipal elevator and underpass and appurtenances necessary therefor for Oregon City, and is issued under the authority of an election duly called and held in said City on May 16, 1952, and Ordinance No. 1388 of said City, approved September 22, 1952, providing for the issuance of said bonds.

For the punctual payment of the principal of, and interest on this bond, the full faith and credit of Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon, are hereby irrevocably pledged.

It is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions, and things required to be done precedent to and in the issuing of this bond have been done, happened, and been performed in regular and due form as required by law and the Charter and Ordinances of Oregon City and that this bond is an obligation of said City, and that the total indebtedness of Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon, including this bond, does not exceed the statutory or constitutional limitations.

In witness whereof Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon, has caused this bond to be signed by its Mayor and attested by its City Recorder under the corporate seal of said City, and has caused the annexed interest coupons to bear the facsimile signatures of said Mayor and Recorder, all as of this 1st day of November, 1952.

At the end of each coupon maturing after November 1, 1962, add the following:

"unless said bond is sooner redeemed as therein provided."

That all the recitals and statements in the aforesaid bonds are true and the full faith and credit of Oregon City are hereby pledged to each successive holder of each of said bonds for the punctual payment of the principal and interest thereof when and as the same become due.

The Mayor and City Recorder of said City are hereby authorized to have said bonds engraved in a suitable manner and to execute the same on behalf of the City and deliver them to the Treasurer of Oregon City who shall deliver them to the purchaser in exchange for the purchase price thereof at Oregon City, Oregon.

Section 2. The Commission shall each year make a special tax levy in an amount sufficient, with other available funds, to pay the principal and interest of the bonds hereby authorized.

Section 3. The City Recorder of said City is hereby directed to publish notice of sale and advertise said bonds for sale at least once each week for not less than two consecutive weeks in the Enterprise Courier, a newspaper of general circulation, printed and published within Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon, which notice and advertisement shall call for sealed, written bids for the purchase of said bonds to be presented and filed with the City Recorder at her office in the City Hall of said City on or prior to the hour of two o'clock P.M., Standard Oregon Time, on the 10th day of October, 1952, at which time and place said bids shall be publicly opened for consideration and further that the Commission of Oregon City will meet at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P.M., Standard Oregon Time on the said 10th day of October, 1952, in the Commission Chambers in the City Hall of said City to consider said bids so opened and to accept or reject any bid so made. Said notice shall further state that the Commission reserves the right to reject any and all bids and shall state that each bid shall be accompanied by a certified check on a bank doing business in the State of Oregon in an amount equal to two per cent of the par value of the bonds offered for sale as evidence of good faith on the part of the bidder, and shall further state that the opinion of Messrs. Winfree, McCulloch, Shuler & Sayre, Attorneys at Law of Portland, Oregon, shall be deemed sufficient as to the legality of the issuance and obligation of said bonds.

Section 4. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, public health and safety of Oregon City, in this: That it is necessary that said Elevator be constructed immediately as the present elevator has outlived it's engineering usefulness and could at any time become hazardous, and the legal voters of Oregon City have authorized a new elevator to be constructed, and that the bonds for the financing thereof should be sold immediately, therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Commission and approval by the Mayor.

Read first time and ordered published at an adjourned regular meeting of the Commission held on the 10th day of September, 1952, and to come up for second reading and final passage at an adjourned regular meeting of the Commission to be held on the 22nd day of September, 1952, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P.M., Standard Oregon Time.

A petition from the property owners of Harrison Street between Seventh and Division Street and on Division Street between Harrison and Molalla Avenue was read requesting that the restriction of parking on the West side of Harrison Street and the South side of Division Street within the above described boundaries be removed. After some discussion the City Manager was instructed to have the necessary resolution prepared in compliance with the request and action would be taken at the next meeting.

Upon motion the City Manager was authorized to purchase a motorized lawn sweeper to cost \$265.00.

The following letter addressed to the City Manager from Stevens & Thompson Engineers, concerning the contract for the construction of the sewage treatment plant was read:

Dear Mr. Finlayson:

In setting up the call of bids for the sewage treatment plant we deleted from the work the sludge storage tank originally called for by the plans. Inasmuch as very favorable bids have been received it would seem advisable to include this in the contractor's work.

First, his bid of \$56 per cubic yard for the concrete and 10.5 cents per pound for the steel is as low a price as has been obtained for concrete work of this kind since 1946 or before. Second, it would be of value to have this storage unit designed as a future digester so that a cover could be installed later if desired. Third, which is of value to the contractor only is that he could use his forms for the digester twice. Fourth, should it be decided to build this unit later it would cost much more it is believed.

There is one other item to be considered at this time and that is the 14" steel pipe for use at Gladstone. In the contract is sufficient pipe to extend 5' outside the building line. However, an alternate provides for sufficient pipe to go around the digester and under our access road. This is a logical cost to Gladstone and not Oregon City. If installed you should bill Gladstone for its cost.

The matter of cables belonging to the Oregon City Sand & Gravel Company extending across the Clackamas River and attached to large trees located on City owned park property on the South side of the Clackamas at its mouth was brought up.
