A request of Clackamas County Civil Defense was presented for office space amounting to approximately 1,000 square feet in the basement of the police station. A request of Mrs. Marie Balkenende, 1003 - 17th Street, for permission to use Kelly Field entrance off Abernathy Road for driving her car into garage in back of her property was presented. After some discussion the Commission decided to investigate the matter and report at the next meeting.

Letters from Mrs. Vera Criteser and Stan Skoko were read and filed.

The City Recorder reported that an investigation had been made through the County Land Agent on the County tax lien property and, since sufficient information was not available, the City Engineer suggested that the matter be dropped.

Information from the Public Employees Retirement System requesting adoption by the City Commission for additional coverage for policemen and firemen was presented. The matter was referred to the City Attorney and City Manager for further investigation.

The Mayor submitted a letter and sub-division regulations for Clackamas County and requested that E. L. Baughman, President of our Planning Commission, attend the meeting and report to the City Commission.

The City Attorney presented the Polajnar claim for chlorine damage to the City Commission. After considerable discussion it was moved by Commissioner Laurs, seconded by Commissioner Helzer, that the claim be settled with Polajnar by paying one-half of \$345 and the insurance company paying one-half of \$345.
