## ORDINANCE NO. 1514

An ordinance providing for procedure without election to annex certain contiguous territory to Oregon City, Clackamas County, Oregon, fixing a day for public hearing before the Commission of Oregon City, on the question of such annexation, directing publication of notice of such hearing, and declaring an emergency.

Oregon City does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Oregon City, a Municipal corporation, Independent Order of Odd Fellows, Oregon Lodge No. 3, an Oregon Corporation, and Multnomah Lodge No. 1, A. F. & A. M., an Oregon Corporation, on April 12, 1957, duly filed with the City Recorder its petition and consent for annexation of the following described real property situated in the County of Clackamas and State of Oregon, and which is contiguous to the present boundaries of Oregon City, to-wit:

TRACT I: Being a part of the Geo. Abernathy D.L.C. #58 and a part of the Hiram Straight D.L.C. #42 in Section 29, T.2S., R.2E. of the W.M.

Beginning at a point on the southerly boundary of the Geo. Abernathy D.L.C. #58 which point is N. 83015' W. 1670 feet distant from the N.W. corner of the Ezra Fisher D.L.C. #44 in T.2S., R.2E., W.M.; thence N. 6 45' E. 43.87 feet to the S.E. corner of that tract of land described in Book 201, Page 102, Deed Records of Clackamas County, Oregon; thence continuing N. 6<sup>0</sup>45' E. 100 feet to an iron pipe set at the N. E. corner of the last mentioned tract, thence N. 83<sup>0</sup>15' W. 293 feet to an iron pipe set at the N. W. corner of a tract described in Book 205, Page 234, Deed Records of Clackamas County, thence continuing N. 83<sup>0</sup>15' W. 103 feet more or less to the southeasterly boundary of a tract conveyed to Oregon City by deed recorded in Book 334, Page 165, Deed Records of Clackamas County, thence S. 41047' W. along southeasterly boundary of said tract a distance of 50 feet more or less to the most southerly corner of said last mentioned tract, thence N. 48 13' W. tracing the southwesterly boundary of said tract 100 feet to an iron pipe at the most westerly corner thereof, said pipe being in the southeasterly boundary of Oregon State Highway No. 160; thence continuing N. 48°13' W. 30 feet to the center of said

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Highway No. 160, which is also the boundary of Oregon City, thence northeasterly along center line of said highway and the boundary of Oregon City, a distance of 723 feet more or less to the north boundary of the Geo. Abernathy D.L.C. #58, thence tracing the northerly boundary of the Geo. Abernathy D.L.C. and the northerly boundary of Oregon City, N. 84<sup>0</sup>30' W. 37 feet more or less to a point on the northwesterly right of way boundary of said State Highway No. 160, thence northeasterly tracing the boundary of said highway 175 feet more or less to an intersection with the northwesterly extension of the northeasterly boundary of a tract conveyed to Oregon City by deed in Book 232, Page 245, Deed Records of Clackamas County, thence S. 48<sup>0</sup>13' E. 61 feet more or less along said northwesterly projection, to an iron pipe set at the most northerly corner of the last mentioned tract, thence continuing S. 48013' E. 491 feet to an iron pipe, thence S. 41°47' W. 610 feet to an iron pipe, thence S. 6°45' W. 62 feet to an iron pipe set at the most southerly corner of a tract conveyed to Oregon City by said deed recorded in Book 232, Page 245, said pipe being in the northerly right of way boundary of Clackamas County Market Road 20, thence continuing S. 6<sup>0</sup> 45' W. 43.87 feet to the southerly boundary of the Geo. Abernathy D.L.C., thence tracing the southerly boundary of said Abernathy D.L.C. N., 83 15' W. 30 feet to the place of beginning. (Commonly known as Kelly Field)

TRACT II. Being a part of the Wm. Holmes D.L.C. #38 in T. 3 S., R.2E., W.M. Beginning at an iron pipe at the S. W. corner of Oregon City Annex according to the official plat thereof, said beginning point being 681.17 feet south and 449.62 feet west of the ½ corner on the north line of Section 5, T.3S., R2E., W.M., thence tracing the easterly boundary of Oregon City and the westerly boundary of a tract of land conveyed to Oregon City by deed recorded in Book 108, Page 21, Deed Records of Clackamas County, south 1544.8 feet to an iron pipe at the southwest corner of said tract, thence N. 61<sup>0</sup>51' E. 260 ft. to a stone, thence S. 28<sup>0</sup>09' E. 40 feet, thence N. 61°51' E. 67 feet to the most northerly corner of that tract described in Book 209, Page 109, Deed Records of Clackamas County, thence S. 24°23' E. 120 feet more or less to an iron pipe set at the most easterly corner of last mentioned tract, said iron pipe being 898.5 feet west of the S. E. corner of that tract conveyed to Oregon Cityby deed recorded in Book 196, Page 456, Deed Records of Clackamas County, thence east tracing south boundary of last mentioned tract, a distance of 898.5 feet to the southeast corner thereof, thence tracing the easterly boundary of said tract and the westerly boundary of Gales Park N. 1050' W. 1125 feet to a stone, thence continuing N. 1°50' W. tracing the westerly boundary of Gales Park and the easterly boundary of that tract conveyed to Oregon City by deed recorded in Book 65, Page 174 Deed Records of Clackamas County, a distance of 419.9 feet to a stone set at the northeast corner of the last mentioned tract, thence continuing N. 1<sup>0</sup>50' W. 60 feet more or less to the northerly side of Broadway according to the official plat of Oregon City Annex, thence westerly tracing the northerly side of Broadway of said plat, a distance of 1200 feet more or less to the southwest, corner of Block 1 of said plat, thence south tracing the west boundary of Oregon City Annex, a distance of 60 feet to the southwest corner thereof, and the place of beginning. (Commonly known as Mountain View Cemetery)

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Section 2. That the Commission of Oregon City does hereby elect to dispense with, and does hereby dispense with submitting the question of the annexation of said property to the registered voters of Oregon City and the Commission does hereby fix Wednesday, November 7, 1962, at 8:00 P.M. in the Commission Chambers in the City Hall at the corner of 7th and John Adams Streets, Oregon City, Oregon, as the time and place for a public hearing before the Commission of Oregon City, at which time and place the registered voters of Oregon City may appear and be heard on the question of such annexation.

Section 3. That the City Recorder cause notice of the time and place of said hearing to be published in the Enterprise-Courier, a newspaper of general circulation in Oregon City, once each week for two successive · · · · · · · · ·

weeks prior to the said date fixed for said public hearing and said City Recorder be and he is further directed to post in four public places in Oregon City, written notices of said hearing and the time and place thereof, for a like period of time.

Section 4. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of Oregon City, in this: That it is necessary that the date of said hearing be set promptly, therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Commission and approval by the Mayor.

Read first time and ordered published at an adjourned regular meeting of the Commission held on the 13th day of September, 1962, and to come up for second reading and final passage at a regular meeting of the Commission to be held on the 3rd day of October, 1962, at the hour of 8:00 P.M.

ORDINANCE NO. 1515 An Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 1250 by adding a new section to be designated Section 13A eliminating compliance with certain sections of said Ordinance in places where no liquor is served and declaring an emergency.

Oregon City does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Ordinance No. 1250, an ordinance amending Article VII of Ordinance No. 1090 relating to pool or billiard rooms and tables and the maintenance and conduct thereof be and the same hereby is amended by inserting therein a new section to be designated as Section 13A, which said section shall follow Section 13 and read as follows:

Section 13A. A public recreation or amusement center where no liquor is served may be licensed by the Commission after due investigation to maintain pool and billiard tables without the necessity of complying with Sections 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9, of this ordinance providing such applicant shall comply with the laws of the State of Oregon applicable thereto and pay the license fee as provided by Ordinance No. 1225.

Section 2. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Oregon City, in this: That it is necessary to regulate pool and billiard rooms where no liquor is served immediately, therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Commission and approval by the Mayor.
