Special Meeting

The City Commission of Oregon City met in special session on the above date in the office of the City Manager in the Municipal Building.

Roll call showed the following present: C. H. Caufield and L. U. Harding, commissioners; J. L. Franzen, City Manager.

The purpose of the meeting was to consider any objections to the proposed assessment for the following improvements:

Railroad Avenue, from the north side of Fifth street to the south side of Seventh street,

Fourth street from the east side of J. Q. Adams street to the concrete pavement on Linn Avenue,

Lincoln street, from the south side of Fourteenth street to the south side of Twelfth street,

Railroad Avenue, from the north side of Eighth street to the south side of Ninth street.

Sewer in District No. 22, Canemah.

One objection was received from Edward G. Smith against the assessment of Lot 6, Block 7 in Canemah. His reason stated that the sewer would not drain his basement. Upon investigation it was found that the sewer was the customary 8 feet in depth, and that the basement of Mr. Smith's property was lower than this depth, a fact that was not known to the city. However it was found that his basement could be drained into the sewer by the construction of a short drain down the alley from his property. It was therefore judged that the assessment was reasonable.
