## RESOLUTION NO. 67-28

Whereas, by Section 13, Chapter 2, Title 10, 1963 City Code, the City Manager, subject to the approval of the City Commission by resolution, may designate stop streets, cross-walks, safety zones, traffic lanes, areas in which no parking shall be permitted and areas in which the time of parking is to be limited, install additional parking meters as required, and direct the placing and maintenance of such traffic signs, markers and signals as may be reasonable and necessary to carry the above powers into effect and also for the regulation and safety of traffic; and

Whereas, after careful study it has been determined that the following areas require traffic regulation,

Now therefore be it resolved by the City Commission of Oregon City that:

1. That parking time in the present parking spaces in the area from and including the south side of 5th Street to and including the northerly side of 11th Street and from and including the easterly side of McLoughlin Boulevard (highway 99E) to and including the westerly side of Railroad Avenue shall be limited to one hour only, except loading zones and parking spaces especially designated as less than one hour parking.

2. That the "Taxi Zones" designation on the three parking spaces in front of the former Oregon City Taxi Service office at 213-6th Street be eliminated.

3. That one parking space directly in front of the Oregon City Laundry, at 510 McLoughlin Boulevard (Highway 99E) be limited to "15 minute parking".

Be it further resolved by the City Commission of Oregon City that the City Manager be and he is hereby authorized and directed as follows:

To install necessary signs, markers and painted areas to carry the powers enumerated above into effect.
