Mayor Cartales opened the meeting by explaining that the City Commission had received complaints regarding the delivery of the Courier Advertiser. These complaints were relative to the method used in delivery as being more in the fashion of littering than delivery.

Mr. Duane Edmonds, Publisher of the Enterprise-Courier, addressed the Commission and presented a brief history of the Courier Advertiser. He noted the advertising and news articles along with the number of employees, which included the independent carriers. He explained the method used was that of a small truck driving slowly along the streets with the papers being tossed onto the yards of residents. The Contractor who delivered the papers would then pass through the streets on the following Friday to pick up the papers that had not been gathered up by the residents. He further noted that he receives less than three complaints per week from the citizenry and that no complaints had been registered with him from the City of Oregon City in the last three years.

Mr. Edmonds introduced Mr. Eldon Clark who is the Contractor engaged in the actual delivery of the Courier Advertiser.

On discussion, the members of the Commission wanted Mr. Edmonds aware of the fact that there is an ordinance against littering and that more control should be exercised in the dispensing of the Courier Advertising.

Mr. Leonard Strobel, City of Gladstone, was present and addressed the matter noting that complaints were received regarding the distribution of the Courier Advertiser in the Gladstone area also.

It was felt that Mr. Edmonds and the contractor, Mr. Clark, were now more aware of the problems that have been encountered and that they would cooperate in resolving these problems.

It was moved by Andersen, seconded by Lemons to approve the minutes of the meetings of May 13 and 28, 1982, as published.
