The City Council met in special session on the above date at 4.30 o'clock

Roll Call, showed the following Present

Mayor Shannon stated the purpose of the meeting was to consider the final passage of the following Ordinances.

An ordinance appropriating the sum of \$7236.27 out of the Cemetery fund and the further sum of \$101.25 out of that part of the general set aside and held as a property fund for the purpose of purchasing Fire Department Bonds, of Oregon City Oregon. Dated July 1st 1921. of the par value of 10,000.00 dollars. with accrued interest; authorizing the Mayor and Recorder to draw Warrants for the same and directing the Treasurer to purchase such bonds and to deposit and hold the same for the benefit of said funds.

On Motion and roll call the vote resulted as follows.

An ordinance providing that vehicles operated for the purpose of Selling or delivering goods, wares, or merchandise, to any person engaged in re-selling the same shall not be operated upon any street in Oregon City except under or by virtue of a license issued by Oregon City and fixing the amount of such license,

On motion and roll call the vote resulted as follows,

The committee ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ on Fire & Water recommended that Lawrence Ruconich, be appointed Chief of the Fire Department and Gerald Warner and Wm. Preibe as Paid firemen when the re-organization of the department takes place.

and that the building occupied by Hose Co. #3 be repaired and used for the temporary quarters for the Company and Fire Apparatus.

it was voted that the recommendations be adopted and the Fire and Water Committee complete said same.
