A communication from Major Park of the War Dept stating that the New Bridge will not be anunreasonable obstruction to navigation; and that it is not proposed to take any action to order the removal or alteration of the Bridge. same was ordered placed on file.

Communication From the State industrial and Accoidient Commission was read and reffered to the committee of the whole at the next special session of the Council to be held march 6th at 7,Oclock P.M.

A communication from the United states Fidelity and Guaranty Co asking that certain rules and regulations for the operation of the Elevator be enforced was read and refered to the Street Committee

A Petition From Oregon Lodge #3 I.O.O.Fasking that a permit be granted to erect a new building on the Corner of Seventh and Washington Street , On Motion, was granted.

A petition asking that the time limit for parking cars between Mai in Street at 6th to main and 8th be made for aperiod of 30 mñutes was read and the matter was discussed and it was voted to leave the ordinance as it is without amendment,

It was voted that the matter of paying the \$500.00 subscribed to the Ferry proposition, be heald up until the next regular meeting of the Council to be held April5th 1922.

In the matter of the report of the appraisers of the Sixth street sewer it was voted to refer the same for objections to the council at a meeting to be held on Friday evening March 17th at 7,30 o'clock P.M.

The Report of City Attorney O D Eby representing the city at the Auto convention held at Roseberg Oregon was submitted, and on motion by Metzner it was voted that the council meet with the Auto Park Association and others that may be interested, at the Commercial Club Parlors Monday Eve, at 7,30.0, clock P.M.

Mr. McGgire representing the Truck Drivers, protested against the Inter Urban and Public Utility Ordinance, and asked that the Council make the fee for such a Franchise as low as possible. No action was taken on the matter.

Councilman Bridges moved that the Fire and Water Committee be authorized to purchase 500 feet of Fire Hose at a price not to exceed the amount provided in the Budget for said purpose, Motion prevailed and so ordered.

It was voted that the City Engineer be instructed to set the line stakes on the alley between 6th & 7th Between Monroe, and J.Q. Adams, and that the Supt of Streets be directed to open to said alley. Councilman Krassig recommended that the side walk at the South West Corner of Monroe street be cleaned off as same was in a filthy condition. The matter was referred to the Street Supt.

Chief of Police recommended that a Motorcycle be purchased so that traffic regulations could be better enforced. The matter was referred to the Health and Police Committee.

The Report of the final estimate for the work done by the W D Andrews Construction Co, on the block on Sixth Street between Main and Water amounting to \$2275.02 was submitted and accepted and on motion by Bridges, it was voted ~~XXXXXX~~ That a warrant for less 10% of the amount be drawn (\$2047.52) on said fund in payment to the W. J Andrews Construction Company, Said Report having the approval of the Street Committee and the City Engineer. and on motion the following resolution was adopted. Resolved, That Friday March the 17th 1922. at the hour of 7,30, o'clock P.M. at the council chamber be and is hereby set as the time and place for considering the acceptance of the Sixth street improvement from the easterly line of Water Street to the Westerly line of Main Street, and the City Recorder is hereby directed to give notice thereof by publication in the Banner-Courier for two weeks prior thereto. So Ordered.

Ordinance No. —

An Ordinance Authorizing the issuance of Improvement bonds in pursuance of an act of the Legislature of the State of Oregon known as the Bonding Act as the same has been amended, Oregon City Does ordain as follows:-

Section 1. That in pursuance of application of owners of property to pay certain assessments for the improvement of streets in Oregon City, Oregon, as provided by an act of the legislative assembly of the State of Oregon, entitled "An Act to provide for the issuance of bonds for the improvement of street and the construction of sewers in incorporated cities and for the paying of the costs of such improvement and the construction of sewers by installments," as amended by an act of the legislature of the State of Oregon, approved February 28th, 1901, entitled "An Act to amend sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 of an act entitled "An Act to provide for the issuance of bonds for the improvement of streets and the laying of sewers in incorporated cities and the paying by installments filed in the office of the secretary of state, February 22, 1893, approved February 28, 1901, and subsequently amendatory act heretofore passed by the legislative assembly of the state of Oregon; the mayor and recorder are hereby authorized and directed to execute improvement bonds of Oregon City, Oregon, and deliver the same to the treasurer of Oregon City, Oregon, who shall retain such bonds until ordered by the financial committee of the city council of Oregon City to deliver said bonds to the successful bidder therefor, who shall pay to the treasurer the amount bid for the said bonds.

Said bonds are issued in payment of a portion of the cost of the streets hereinafter named and shall not exceed the sum of \$6145.95 and for the respective street named shall be as follows:

12th Street, seven bonds of the denomination of \$500.00 each and one bond for \$109.18, all dated November 1st, 1921.

8th Street, four bonds of the denomination of \$500.00 each and one bond for \$398.66, all dated December 1st, 1921.

The Alley in Block 24, one bond of \$138.11 dated November 1st, 1921.

United States of America and bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, interest payable semi-annually, said interest to be evidenced by coupons attached to said bonds, provided, however, the right to take up or cancel said bonds upon the payment of the face thereof with all accrued interest to the date of payment on any semi-annual interest paying period, at or after One year from the date of said bonds, is hereby reserved to Oregon City.

Section 2. The treasurer of Oregon City is hereby directed to credit, upon receiving the purchase price of said bonds, the face value thereof and accrued interest to the said improvement fund and all premiums to the general fund of Oregon City.

Section 3. Whereas the City Council of Oregon City has heretofore found that the condition of these streets is and was dangerous to the health and safety of Oregon City, and have let contracts for the immediate improvement of the streets, and whereas the said streets are in such condition as to be dangerous to the health and safety of the public and that it is necessary to provide funds for the continuance of the improvements thereof, and the said continuance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the health and safety of the public, in the judgment of the city council of Oregon City an emergency exists, therefore this ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its approval by the mayor.

Read first time at a regular meeting of the city council held on March 1st, 1922, at 8 o'clock P.M. and ordered published to come up for second reading and passage at a special meeting of the city council to be held on the 17th day of March 1922, at 7:30 o'clock P.M.
