The City Recorder was instructed to provide insurance on the Police Automobile,

A petition from the property owners having property abutting on Rail Road Ave between 7th and 9th Street asking the commission to order the improvement of same was read and on motion was laid on the table to be considered at a future meeting,

The City Recorder was directed to furnish the City Attorney with a list of all delinquent assessment liens . .

The Recorder stated that a meeting between the Commissioners and the County Court had been arranged for the Evening of March 6th

From the West side of Center Street to the West side of Taylor street with a six inch concrete Pavement eighteen feet wide Estimate \$15301.00

Washington Street
For the Improvement of Washington Street from the pavement on 14th and Washington Street to the North side of Fifth Street with a six inch concrete Pavement 18 feet wide. Estimated cost. \$15785.00

Fifth Street from the East side of High Street to the East side of Jackson Street with a Six inch concrete Pavement 18 feet wide Estimated cost 12690.00

Jackson Street Easterly Half.
From North side of 16th street to North side of 17th street with Standard Macadam, estimated cost \$1670.00
