

## Council Chamber, Oregon City, Oregon.

April 1st, 1914.

The City Council of Oregon City met in regular session on the above date at 8 o'clock, p.m.

The minutes of the meeting of March 27th were read and approved.

The following Resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of Oregon City that the City Attorney be, and he hereby is instructed to prepare an Ordinance providing for the pavement of Main Street with vitrified brick on concrete base from Moss Street to Second Street, was passed by a unanimous vote of the Council.

The application of Bailey and Price for a Pool Room License for the ensuing three months was granted.

By vote of the Council it was voted that all Pool Room proprietors be notified to strictly comply with the law in the operation of their Pool rooms.

The application of F. F. Curren for a pool room license was considered and by vote of the Council a permit was granted until the 8th day of April, 1914.

The Application of Hungate and Gross to have the pool room License of Ruconich and Gross transfered was by vote of the Council granted, said pool room to be run thereafter by Hungate and Gross.

The application of C.G.Miller and wife for permission to change their parking placed next to the property line instead of next the curb on Seventh Street together with the Application of Ers Chase and E.L.Shaw for chang of their parking was considered by the Council and it was voted that the whole council meet on the grounds where the change was desired at 2 p.m. of April 2nd, 1914 tp personally inspect the proposition.

The application of the rural mail carriers asking to construct a barn in the rear of the Postoffice grounds was denied by vote of the council.

The application of W.H.Lucke for permission to construct a railroad spur across Moss Street below the bluff was referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property, and the construction of all buildings to be under the control of said committee.

The application of A.Waterline for a rebate of the interest on his assessment against Lots 7 and 8, Block 122 was referred to a committee composed of "Councilmen Tooze, Meyer and Albright, and the City Attorney for investigation and report at a later meeting of the Council.

The monthly reports of the City Recorder and of the Chief of Police were read and ordered filed.

The quarterly report of the City Treasurer was read and ordered filed.

The following Ordinance entitled "Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_ An Ordinance to establish the grade of that portion of East Street between the South side of OakmStreet and the South side of Fourth Street" was read first time and ordered published and to come up for second reading and final passage at a special meeting of the said city council to be held on the 15th day of April, 1914, at 7:30 o'clock, p.m.

The following Ordinance entitled "Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_ An Ordinance to establish the grade of thatvprt of Fourth Street lying between the West line of East Street and the West line of County Street" was read first time and ordered published and to come up for second reading and final passage at a special meeting of the said city council to be held on the 15th day of April, 1914, at 7:30 o'clock, p.m.

It was voted that the City Treasurer use such idle money as he may have on hand in the various funds for the payment of current expenses and calling of warrants and issue warrants on the General Fund in- re-payment thereof at such times as same may be needed for interest coupons, etc.

The Finance Committee having examined the following claims against the city and finding them correct in the amounts herein stated recommended that the same be ordered paid by warrants drawn on the respective funds in payment thereof.

It was voted that the City Attorney report the status of Division Street as far as the City Limits.

The question of Employing Mr.John T. May special automobile police was referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property for the purpose of making satisfactory arrangements with Mr.May.

Mr.Templeton at this time discussed the needs of the City Streets and among other things stated, that the City should own its Rock Crusher, Road Roller, Auto Truck, Dump wagons, Sacrifier, Scrapers etc.

It was voted that the matter of procuring gravel and crusher rock and all other matters pretaining to street improvements be referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property and the City Engineer with a request that they should submit recommendations pertaining to the streets of Oregon City at their earliest convenience.


The question of the removal of the weeds and grass growing along the macadam streets of Oregon City was referred to the committee on Streets and Public Property.

It was voted by the Council that the Committee on Health and Police, investigate the condition of the Harding Building on Main St. where the fire occurred some months ago, with power to act.

By unanimous vote of the Council it was ordered that all of the telegraph poles and electric wire poles along Duane Street and all parts of the city be painted and the Recorder was instructed to notify the proper authorities to do the same within ten days.

Upon the recommendation of the Committee on Streets and Public Property it was ordered that an electric light be installed at the Northeast corner of Eleventh and Center Streets.

On motion the Council adjourned.
