The following report of the special committee relative to the license fee in connection with the M.J. Lee Jitney Franchise was read and ordered filed:

Oregon City, Apr. 5-20.

To the Hon. Mayor and City Council of Oregon City, Oregon.

We, your committee appointed to confer with M.J. Lee and the business men of Oregon City, with reference to the motor bus franchise held by said M.J.Lee, beg leave to report that we have held a meeting with such perons and after due consideration unanimously report as follows:

First: That M.J. Lee pay to the city councilal sums ofmoney for which he is now delinquent to Oregon City, by reason of his having operated under said franchise.

Sevond: That a new franchise be granted to the said M.J.Lee, taking the place of the present one, at a charge to him of the sum of five dollars quarterly, and that said franchise contain all the terms, conditions and stipulations contained in the present franchise with the exception of the amount to be paid to oregon City as above stated.

It was voted to request Mr. Lee to pay all license fees due or to be arrests for running without fullfilling all the obligations of his franchise, the vote resulted in a tie, Mayor Holman cast the deciding vote to carry the motion. Ayes: Tobin, Kelly, Green and Krueger (4)

The chairman of the fire and water committee asked for further time in which to carry out the investigation of the hose and fire equipment, the request was granted.

Mr. Tobin report progress for the committee on City Hall and fire equipment and asked until Wednesday, Apr. 14-1920 at 7:30 p.m. with which to report, request was granted.

The G.A.R. asked that a committee be appointed to act with them and the American Legion in celebrating Decoration Day, the Mayor appointed the following councilmen: Eby, Tobin and Albright.

The Health officer report thru Mr.Kelly that there were no cases under quarintine and that the health of the city was normal.

Mr. Spagle asked for a report of the investigation of the language used by Night Officer Surfus to an ex-soldier and the matter was referred back to the committee in health and police.

Mr. Green reported that his committee had decided to empty small sewer pipe into the manhole at the top of Singer Hill and require the large pipe to carry the entire sewerage. No action was taken.

The committee on streets and public property reported progress in the repairing of the Elevator and stated that same should be running within the next ten days.

The Mayor set Monday, May 3rd, 1920 as Clean Up Day and requested that publicity be given same.

Mr. Howell called attention to the condition of the pavement on South Main Street near Hawley Mills. Voted that the Recorder notify the company of condition of Lain Street and request the said company to make proper repairs of same.

On motion the council adjourned to meet again in regular session on the 14th day of April, 1920 at 7/30 p.m.
