ON motion the report was Adopted.

An ordinance. authorizing the Mayor and City Recorder to enter into a contract for the sale of lots land 2 of Block 145 of Oregon City for the sum of \$900.00 and upon completion of the payment of said sum to make and deliver a deed and abstract therefore, Was read the second time and placed on its final passage.
Ayes. Albright. Bridges. Cross. VanAukin. Mount. Metzner. Petzold. Krassig.
Noes none.

The reports of the City Recorder and Chief of Police were submitted read and adopted.

A communication from the Commercial Club and Live Wires indorseing the 7th street and Rail Road Avenue route for the Proposed Highway was read, and ordered placed on file.

Estimate for repairing the 14th Street Bridge was submitted by W G H Krueger for Probable cost of \$1,000.00 was read. And ordered placed on file.

A resolution from the Live Wires, opposing the granting of a Jitney Franchise from Oregon City to Portland was read and ordered placed on file.

It was voted to grant permission to the portland Gas Co to cut Pavement at 511 Main Street to make repairs to gas main.

On motion. Permission was granted to I E Krueger to use part of sidewalk and street at the corner of 7th and main while wrecking building at said corner.

Communication from W T Smith manager of the Oregon City Brass Band asking the Council to aid them in a financial way to maintain their band, was read, And on motion was referred to the Finance Committee.

Communication from the Oregon Surety & Casualty Co. stating That the Portland Gas Co had filed their Surety Bond For Digging up streets was read and ordered placed on file.

A request from Willard P Hawley that permission be granted to string wire across main street from a point on the bluff to the Hawley Pulp & paper Co. Plant 120 ft above Main Street for Wireless plant was on motion Granted.

A petition from Property Owners at the termini of the south end road asking for the extention of the sewer to the South West corner of of Block 70. On motion The matter was referred to the Street Committee.

MT View cemetery

In the matter of block A & B 76 Claimed by Mrs Minnie Cline was submitted to the Council by Chairman VanAukin of the Cemetery Committ and on motion The Matter was referd back to the Committee with power to act.

Communication from Mayor Baker Indorseing the Color Film Behold The Man was read and ordered placed on file.

Report of the appraisment of the property affected by the 3rd Street improvement was submitted by the appraisers. Mr E G Gaufield J E Jack and John Bradley. on motion it was voted to refer the matter to the street committee.

Mrs C Stratton submitted a plan for an addition on the front of the Tracey house at 814 main the matter was referred to the City Engineer.

A petition for the improvement of 15th street from Jackson to Division Street was submitted and on motion was referred to the street Committee.

A petition for an arc light on Eluria Street was submitted and on motion the petition was granted and so ordered.

A petition from the property owners from Harrison street seventh southerly to Division street from the intersection with Harrison street Easterly to Mollalla Avenue. It was voted to refer the same to the City Engineer to make estimate and cost of same.

In the matter of taxes on the lots sold to J E Ramsay it was voted that the city pay the same and so ordered.

In the matter of the Jitney franchise between Oregon City and Portland supported by representatives from Oswego and Clackmas, was taken up by the Council and on motion the matter was referred to the Street Committee,

An Ordinance regulating and licencing the sale of milk. was submitted by the City Attorney, And on Motion it was voted to consider this to be the first reading, and the same to be ordered published and the same to come up for final passage, June 1st 1921 at the regular meeting, of the Council. at 7.30 P.M.

On motion the Council voted to meet on the 5th day of May at 4.30 o'clock to canvas the vote on the 30,000.00 dollar Bond Issue,

An ordinance Changing the grade of John Adams street from the north line of 7th street to the south line of 9th street was read and on motion it was ordered published and to come up for final passage at the regular meeting June 1st 1921.

the matter of houseing Joseph McDermott. Councilmen Petzold reported That the cost of same was \$90.03 of which the County Paid \$50.03 and asked that the City pay the balance \$40.00 and on Motion it was so Ordered, Ayes Albright. Bridges. Cross. VanAukin. Krassig. Petzold Metzner. Mount.

The Street committee was instructed to allow a tent to be placed on the City property at south 2nd Street for the use of a needy family.

The County Court of Clackamas County, submitted a plan whereby an adjustment between the city and the County regarding the citys part of payment towards the new Bridge between West Linn and Oregon City It was Voted to refer the matter to the Chairman of the street Committee Dr. H.S. Mount with power to act.

There being no futher business the Council adjourned to meet in Special session May 5th at 4.30 P.M.
