On motion a Warrant was ordered drawn in the amount of \$100.00 in favor of the American Red Cross for the purpose of relief for the Mississippi Flood Victims.


Mr. Joseph Lynch appeared before the Commission in regard to his sewer assessment on Lot 4 of Block 17 for which Mr. Lynch claimed he had made all payments. As there was some doubt in the matter the Recorder was instructed to accept the sum of \$12.93 in full payment of the lien against said lot.

Mr. James McFarlane appeared before the Commission in regard to the assessment on Block 57, Lot 4. He also claimed that these payments had been made some time ago. As there was some doubt as to the amounts paid by Mr. McFarlane the Recorder was instructed to accept the sum of \$10.23 in full payment of the claims.

The Certificate of Completion of the Alley in Block 22, by the Oregon Contract Company, was filed and on motion the same was accepted.

A petition was presented for the improvement of John Adams Street from the north line of Ninth Street to the north line of Tenth Street. On motion the City Engineer was instructed to prepare plans, specifications and estimates for the same.
