The minutes of the regular meeting of the Council held May 6, 1903; and Special Meetings of May 11 and 15 1903 read and approved.

An Invitation from the Salem Fairways Managers asking the City Council to attend was read and upon motion the Recorder was instructed to accept the same and thank said Managers therefor.

A petition from the Hotel and Restaurant-keepers of Oregon City asking that a license ordinance be passed providing a license for temporary eating places, was read and ordered filed.

A communication from John Lowry offering \$400⁰⁰ for Lots 5 & 6 of Block 15 of Oregon City was read and upon motion referred to Finance Committee to report at next meeting.

The report of the Assessors of Town District No. 3 was read and upon motion approved and ordered filed.

The report of the recorder for the month of May 1903 was read and ordered filed.

Ordinance No -

Enacted "An Ordinance to license Restaurants and eating Houses in Ogden City" was read the first time and upon motion referred to the Finance Committee to report.

Ordinance No. —

Entitled "An ordinance providing for the laying and building of sidewalks on unimproved streets in Oregon City" was read the first time and upon motion ordered published.

Ordinance No. —

Entitled "An ordinance to define the fire limits of Oregon City and prohibit the erection and repair of wooden buildings within such limits" was read the first time and upon motion ordered published.

Ordinance No. —

Entitled "An ordinance declaring the probable cost of the proposed system of sewers as provided for in ordinance No 28, and assessing the cost thereof to the several lots, parts of lots and tracts of land benefited thereby and directing an entry of such assessment in the docket of city liens" was read the first time and upon motion ordered published and to come up for second reading and final passage at a Special meeting of the City Council to be held June 22nd 1903 at 8 o'clock P. M.

Ordinance No. 285

Entitled "An ordinance providing for the time and manner of improving Jackson Street in Oregon City, Oregon, from the southerly line of Fifth Street to the southerly line of Thirteenth Street" was read the second time and it appearing from the affidavit of L. L. Foster, printer and publisher of the Oregon City Enterprise, that said ordinance had been published as required by Charter, upon motion said ordinance was placed upon its final passage and upon Roe's call

passed. The vote being as follows:

Ayes: Councilman, Huntley, Korman, Kelly, Mason, Powers, Prister, Scott, (7) Noes (0) Absent Councilman Stoy & Shashan
(2) The Mayor announced that the ordinance had passed.

The Mayor stated that nominations for the office of Water Commissioners, were in order, and Thompson J. E. Hedger and J. L. Pharnam were nominated for said office. The Mayor appointed Councilman Kelly and Shashan as tellers and the ballot was cast and counted with the following result J. E. Hedger received five votes and J. L. Pharnam received three votes. J. E. Hedger having received a majority of the votes, said and that being a majority of all the votes of the Council was declared duly elected Water Commissioner for the ensuing term of three years.

A communication from the Board of Water Commissioners regarding better protection for the pumping station was read and ordered filed.

On motion the Chief of Police was instructed to notify all persons owning property within First Districts 1 & 2 and having any vaults on the same to remove them at once and if said property owners did not remove said vaults within five days after receiving such notice the Chief of Police was instructed to make complaints against said person and bring them before the Recorder.

On motion the Recorder was authorized to purchase an ordinance record and a minute book.

On motion the Chief of Police was instructed to post cloth notices prohibiting the riding of bicycles upon the sidewalks.

On motion it was ordered that the \$1000.⁰⁰ heretofore appropriated by the City and the sum raised by subscription for the construction of a road in the South end of Ocean City be placed in the hands of the Street Committee in conjunction with the Citizens Committee in order that work may be commenced on said road with the least possible delay.

On motion the Chief of Police was instructed to enforce the ordinance providing for licensing agents soliciting for pictures.

On motion the Council adjourned
