The City Council of Oregon City, Oregon, met in regular session on the the above date at 7:30 o'clock, p.m.

The minutes of the meeting of the City Council held on the 29th day of June, 1916, were read and approved.

The communication from the Willamette river Sanitation association was read and the matter was laid over for investigation.

Petition of R.P. Grady and E.J. Jones for Jitney Service between Oregon City and Oswego and in the city it was voted that July 20th, 1916 at 7:30 o'clock, p.m. in the council chamber was the time and place for the hearing and considering of said matter.

The application of F.D. Cox, to operate a Pool and Billiard Hall at 708 Main Street was on motion granted.

The application of L. Hylton to operate a Pool Hall at 415 Main Street was on motion granted.

Mr. Templeton came in and was recorded present.

This being the time for the hearing of the objections to the re-assessment for the improvement of J.Q. Adams Street, Oregon City, Oregon from the South line of Eighth Street to the south line of Fourteenth Street, the council took up the said objections and heard the same and after duly considering said objections, and also duly considering the said assessment find that each lot, part of lot, or parcel of

of land within the said district is specially and peculiarly benefitted by said improvement in the amounts so set forth and in the judgement of the council said property should be re-assessed in said amounts.

The following ordinance entitled "Ordinance No. \_\_\_ An Ordinance approving and confirming the re-assessment for the improvement of J.Q.Adams Street from the south line of Eighth Street to the south line of Fourteenth Street" was read first time and ordered published and to come up for second reading and final passage at a special meeting of the said city council to be held on the 20th day of July, 1916, at 7:30 o'clock, p.m.

The question of sewer connections for Mr. Story was discussed but no action taken.

At this point Mr. Babcock came in and was recorded present.

Mr. Metzner also came in and was recorded present.

Mr. Miller asked to be excused at this point from further attendance and the request was granted.

The report of the chief of police for the month of June, 1916, was read and ordered placed on file.

The report of the city pound master for the quarter ending June 30th, 1916 was read and ordered placed on file.

The report of the City Recorder for the month of June, 1916, was read and ordered filed.

The quarterly report of the City Treasurer for the quarter ending June 30th, 1916 was read and ordered published and filed.

The semi-annual report of the Board of Water Commissioners was read, ordered published and filed.

The report of the balance left in the various departments of the City, as per allowance in the City's Budget was read and ordered filed.

The following Ordinance entitled "Ordinance No. \_\_\_ An Ordinance authorizing the Portland Railway, Light & Power Company, its successors and assigns, to construct, maintain and operate a railway on Third Street in Oregon City, and to erect the necessary poles and string the necessary wires for the operation thereof, and to carry freight and express matter on and over said street railway on said company's railway on Main Street in said Oregon City, and to collect charges and tolls for carrying freight and express matter, for the said railway," was read second time and placed upon its final passage and it appearing from the certificate of Charlotte Baker, principal clerk of the publisher and printer of the Morning Enterprise that the same had been properly published as required by the charter and on motion and roll call the ordinance passed the vote resulting as follows:
