The minutes of the regular meeting of the Council held July 4-1900, the adjourned meetings held July 5-1900 and July 9-1900 and the regular meeting held Aug. 1-1900 read and approved.

Application of Kelly & Robbitt for renewal of Saloon license for Saloon on Main Street between 3rd & 4th Streets, was read and it appearing from the affidavit of W. E. Campbell, printer and publisher of the Oregon City Enterprise that said applicants have published, as required by Charter, a notice of their intention to apply at this time for a license and it further appearing that no remonstrance or objection to the granting of same has been filed, on motion the said application was granted, and the Recorder instructed to issue said license.

The petition of S. F. Scripture et al., asking that 15th Street from John Adams St. to Jefferson St. be improved was read and

on motion referred back to petitioners, with a recommendation that they raise the full cost of said improvements and then ask that the improvements be made.

The Records Report for the month ending Aug 1st 1900 was read and ordered filed.

Ordinance No.

Entitled an Ordinance authorizing the purchase of not to exceed 31,000 feet of lumber for the repair of Main Street was read the first time and on motion ordered published.

The election of a Sexton for Mountain View Cemetery, for the ensuing year being in order, the following persons were placed in nomination. Pres. Bluhm and J. Williamson, the rolls were cast with the following result; Bluhm received 4 votes and Williamson received 3 votes. Bluhm having received a majority of all the votes cast was declared duly elected Sexton of Mountain View Cemetery for the ensuing year.

On motion the Committee on Fire & Water was requested to recommend to the Board of Water Commissioners that they place two Fire Hydrants on 4th St.

The Committee on Streets & Public Property was authorized to close a contract with J. H. Cunningham, as engineer, during the construction of the sewer system in District No 2. at 3% of the contract price for the construction of said Sewer System.

On motion the Mayor appointed a committee consisting of Councilmen Phorman, Albright and Powell, to consult an Engineer regarding the building of a road up the bluff in the South end of town.
