The City Council of Oregon City, Oregon met in regular session on the above date at the hour of 7<sup>30</sup> o'clock P.M.

The minutes of the regular meeting of the City Council held July 3, 1901, were read and approved.

The petitions of Keen & Noble for renewal of Saloon license for Saloon on Main St. bet. 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> Sts and Edward Byrnes for Saloon at cor of Railroad Ave and 7<sup>th</sup> St., were read and it appearing from the affidavits of L. L. Postel, printer and publisher of the Oregon City Enterprise that said applicants had published as required by law a notice of their intention to make application at this time and it further appearing that no remonstrance to the granting of same has been filed, on motion the Recorder was authorized to issue said licenses.

The petition of Mrs. S. E. Knotts asking further time in which to make first connection was read and on motion referred to Committee on

## Streets & Public Property.

On motion the Recorder was instructed to inform the Board of Water Commissioners that it was the sense of the City Council that water mains be placed on all streets running North & South so that all parties wishing water might have it.

A remonstrance signed by a majority of the resident property owners on Center Street between 5<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> St. against the improvement of said Center Street from 5<sup>th</sup> St. to 7<sup>th</sup> St. was read and on motion it was ordered that said Center Street be not improved.

The Report of the City Treasurer for the quarter ending June 30-1901 was read and ordered referred to the Finance Committee.

On motion the Chief of Police was instructed to notify all parties who were delinquent in the payment of their street assessment that the same must be paid within 2 weeks or the city would proceed to collect same according to the Charter.

The Recorder's Report for July 1901 was read and ordered filed.

The following claims against the city having been examined by the Finance Committee and found correct in the amounts herein stated were on motion and Res. Call allowed and the Recorder instructed to draw warrants on the respective funds in payment thereof:

On motion the Street Superintendent was instructed to collect the Road Tax Day.

Ordinance No. —

Enacted an Ordinance providing for the lighting of Oregon City and authorizing execution of an agreement with Portland General Electric Company therefor, was read the first time and on motion and Roll Call ordered published.

Ordinance No. —

Enacted an ordinance authorizing the sale and conveyance of certain real property in Oregon City, was read the first time and on motion ordered published.

The Mayor declared the election of a Sexton for Mt. View Prec. to be in order and the names of John Sillett, J. Williamson, P. D. Curran and T. Bluhm were placed in nomination. The Mayor appointed tellers and the ballot was cast with the following result: John Sillett received 3 votes, P. D. Curran received 1 vote and T. Bluhm received 5 votes. Bluhm having received a majority of all the votes of the City Council was declared duly elected Sexton of Mt. View Precinct for the ensuing year.

On Motion and Roll Call the Committee on Streets and Public Property was authorized to purchase 25000 feet of bridge lumber.

The following resolution introduced by Councilman Shively was read and upon motion adopted.

Resolved that it is the sentiment of this Council that Ordinance No. 201 under which the P. & O. R. R. is now

operating an express cot is in the judgement of this Council fair and equitable and that a new ordinance granting graded privileges will not be considered.

On motion the Committee on Streets & Public Property was empowered to make an extension of the sewer outlet.

On motion the Committee on Streets & Public Property was instructed to notify Mrs Walker to take up his fish drain sewer and replace the same by regulation salt glazed sewer pipe.

On motion the Committee on Streets and Public Property was instructed to remove obstructions on Jackson St., and to build a foot bridge and make necessary improvements.

The Committee on Fire & Water was instructed to request the Street Commissioners to place fire hydrants at cor. of 11<sup>th</sup> & Jackson St. and 7<sup>th</sup> & Adams St.

On motion the Committee on Fire & Water was authorized to purchase five fire hydrants.

On motion the Committee on Health & Police was instructed to notify all parties owning property within the sewer districts to connect said premises with the sewers of said districts within four weeks from date.

On motion the Council adjourned
