Petition of J. A. Thayer and others asking for the improvement of 15th Street between J. A. Adams and Madison Streets read and on motion referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property.

Petition of E. E. Charman and others asking the City to build a road from the South end of Main Street to Center Street at the top of the bluff read and on motion referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property.

Petition of W. H. Burghardt and others asking that a franchise be granted to construct, maintain and operate a railway in Oregon City, read and on motion referred to the Finance Committee.

Petition of W. H. Burghardt agent, asking for

a franchise to construct, maintain and operate a railway in Oregon City, read and on motion referred to the Finance Committee.

The Finance Committee made a verbal report favorable to granting W. H. Burghardt, Agent, a franchise to operate a Street Railway

within the city limits of Oregon City, on motion the matter ^{was} referred back to the Finance Committee with instructions to make a report at next meeting.

Ordinance No. 226

Entitled an ordinance empowering the Committee on Fire and Water to purchase a fire bell was read for the second time and it appearing from the affidavit of W.E. Bain, publisher of the Oregon City Press that the said ordinance had been published as required by Charter, on motion and Roll Call it was placed upon its final passage and declared passed. All Councilmen present voting in the affirmative.

Ordinance No. 227

Entitled an ordinance creating a Road Fund, was read for the second time, and it appearing from the affidavit of W.E. Bain, publisher of the Oregon City Press that the said ordinance had been published as required by Charter, on motion and Roll Call it was placed upon its final passage and declared passed. All Councilmen present voting in the affirmative.

Ordinance No. 228

Entitled an ordinance instructing the Mayor and Recorder to execute and deliver a quit claim deed in the name of the city to certain property in the city known as the Ross property: read and on motion the same was ordered published.

Committee on Fire and Water asked and were granted further time in which to report.

On Motion the Committee on Streets and Public Property were instructed, to construct a Culvert on 7th and Center Streets and make all necessary improvements for taking care of the water on 7th Street at the top of the bluff.

On motion Committee on Streets and Public Property were instructed to advertise for bids for repairing and to contract for the repair of the West side of Main Street from 14th Street North across the Abornthy Bridge.

On Motion the Recorder was instructed to purchase 500 Warrants for the Road Fund.

On Motion Council adjourned.
