The City Council of Oregon City Met in Special session on the above date at the Council chamber at the hour of 5,oclock. P.M.
With Mayor Shannon in the chair,

Roll call showed the following present Roake, Cameron, Greaves, VanAukin.
Krassig, Metzner, absent Mount, Beatie,

The Mayor stated that the purpose of the meeting was to consider the passage of certain Ordinances and to consider any other business that come before the Council

An Ordinance declaring the assessment for the improvement of 15t street from Division to Harrison street was read second time and affidavit showing same had been published according to law was placed on its final passage the vote resulting as follows, Ayes, Roake, Cameron, Greaves, VanAukin. Krassig, Metzner, Noes none, absent Beatie, Mount, ordinance approved by the Mayor,

An Ordinance authorizing the City Council to enter into a contract with one C.J.Hamm to audit the books of Oregon City and directing the Mayor and City Recorder to sign and excute said contract was placed on its second reading and final passage, an affidavit showing that same had been published according to law, and on motion was placed on its final passage and the vote resulted as follows, Ayes, Roake, Cameron, Greaves, VanAukin Krassig, Metzner, noes none, Absent Beatie, Mount, ordinance approved by the Mayor,

Mrs Lents of the Benson Hotel complained to the council that the music in the 5th Street Restaurant was disturbing her roomers by being allowed to play after 10,oclock P.M. and asked that the council do something to remidey the matter, On motion the City Attorney was instructed to draw an ordinance to prevent the playing of Music in restaurants after 10,0,clock P.M.

ORDINANCE 970
An ordinance prohibiting the playing of music in restaurants after 11 o'clock, P. M.
Oregon City does ordain as follows:
Section 1. It shall be unlawful for the owner or proprietor of any restaurant adjoining or connected to a lodging house or a hotel in Oregon City, Oregon, to play, or to permit music to be played after 11 o'clock P. M.
Section 2. Any person violating this ordinance shall be punished by fine not to exceed the sum of \$50.00.
Read the first time and ordered published to come up for second reading and final passage at the regular meeting to be held on the 3rd day of October, 1923.

ORDINANCE
An ordinance establishing the grade of the alley in Block 66, Oregon City, Oregon.
Oregon City does ordain as follows:
Section 1. The grade of the alley in Block 66, Oregon City, Oregon, is established as follows:
Beginning at the center of the alley in Block 66, Oregon City, Oregon on the West side of John Adams Street at the elevation of 219.8 feet, thence 42 feet Westerly to elevation of 219.3; thence on a vertical curve 60 feet to elevation of 216.6 feet thence descend to Washington Street at center of the alley to elevation of 203.5 feet.
Read the first time and ordered published at the regular meeting of the City Council held on the 5th day of September, 1923, to come up for second reading and final passage at a regular meeting of the City Council to be held on the 3rd day of October, 1923.

The following Resolution was introduced by Councilmen Beatie
WHEREAS there seems to be some evidence tending to show that one or more of the city,s officers are devoting time to the State,s or County,s service and receiving pay therefor while in the employ of this City and receiving a reasonable salary fromit, and WHEREAS one of the officers of the City has made statements tending to involve members of the Fire Dept in wrongful acts of drinking.
THEREFOR, be it resolved, that it is the sense of this body that two employers cannot be served at the same time by an office r, and that one cannot efficiently do his duty if he drinks while on duty, and Be it further resolved that the Mayor appoint a committee of eight (8)members ~~XXXXXX~~ of the council to make a complete investigation of the charges against the officers, and the department, and to that end the committee be empowered to call witnesses and to incur obligations necessary to complete the investigation, and that the said committee report to the council within a reasonable time, the date To be appointed by the Mayor
On Motion the Resolution was adopted, And the Mayor set the date for the committee to report as Sept 19, 1923

The City Engineer was instructed to issue a permit to The W.C.T.U. to make temporary repairs to the building now used as a rest room,
Dr Huycke and C.W.Pope asked that permission be granted to them to erect a garrage in the street at 13th and Monroe Street, the matter was refered to the Street committee and City Engineer with power to act,

In the matter of reshingleing the Fire Department puarters the same was refered to the Fire and Water committee with power to act,

The Street Committee and City Enginecr was instructed to confer with the County Court and see if they would co-operate with the City in building a new bridge across the Abernethy creek at 17th and Washington Stteet

The Mayor stated that the purpose of the Meeting was to consider ways and means to provide a bridge across the Abernethy Creek at 17th and Wash St, and the Following Ordinance was read,

ORDINANCE 966
 An ordinance appropriating the sum of \$4,500.00 or so much thereof as may be necessary out of the general fund of Oregon City, Oregon, for the construction of a bridge across the Abernathy, on Washington Street, Oregon City, Oregon.
 Oregon City does ordain as follows:
 Section One: There is hereby ap propriated out of the general fund of Oregon City, Oregon, the sum of \$4,500.00, or as much thereof as may be necessary, for the purpose of building a bridge over the Abernathy, on Washington Street, in Oregon City, Oregon.
 The Mayor and City Recorder of Oregon City are hereby authorized to enter into a contract with person, firm or corporation designated by the City Council of Oregon City as the lowest responsible bidder for said bridge.
 Owing to the dangerous condition of said bridge, and the necessity of speedily rebuilding the same to preserve the peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of Oregon City, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, this ordinance to take immediate effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
 Passed the first reading and ordered published at a special meeting of the City Council held on the 8 day of September, 1923, to come up for second reading and final passage at a special meeting of the City Council to be held on the 17 day of September, 1923.
